Interfaith Prayer Service

An Interfaith Prayer Service was held for Sandeep Singh Dhaliwal, the first turbaned Sikh deputy in America, at the Guru Gobind Singh Foundation Spiritual Center. Prayers for the late Deputy Dhaliwal, his family, the Sikh community and our nation facing increased gun violence were offered by Rev. Mansfield Kaseman, Interfaith Community Liaison; Rabbi Gary Pokrus of Temple Beth Ami; Imam Mohamed Abdullahi of the Muslim Community Center; Rev. Anne Derse of St. John's Episcopal Church, Norwood Parish; Venerable Bhante Katugastota Uparatana of the Maryland Vihara Center; and Rabbi Gerry Serotta, Interfaith Conference of Metropolitan Washington.

The service was moderated by Dr. Rajwant Singh, President of the Sikh Spiritual Center, and included condolences and a moving tribute for the sacrificial leadership of Deputy Dhaliwal by Chief Marcus Jones.
