Challenges for Immigrant Parents

On December 21, 2019, Immigrant Community Services and The Barrie Law Center hosted a workshop that explored the parenting challenges faced by immigrant families in the United States. This workshop, held at the Silver Spring Civic Center, provided valuable information to immigrant parents about the process of acculturation and the positive outcomes of bicultural identity for their first generation American children and immigrant children raised in the United States. Parents were guided through activities that facilitated understanding and increased awareness of stressors and traumatic events that may have a significant impact on child learning and development. Other areas of focus included immigration and the current political climate, which add additional stress to immigrant families and affect their children. Approximately 30 people attended this event, which marked the beginning of a series of workshops with a focus on immigrant parent/child relationships and the navigation of the U.S. system. Dr. Rabiatu E. Barrie, a clinical psychologist and professor at Adler University in Chicago, facilitated the workshop.
