





that you acted out of ignorance, just as your leaders did;


but God has thus brought to fulfillment

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread.



- 2. There is no sorrow, pain or woe; there is no suffering he did not know. He did not waver; he did not bend. He is the victor. He is my friend.


