- Approved motion from Worship Committee to suspend live, in-person Worship Service Sunday, December 25. We will use the virtual service from Foothills Presbytery that day.

History



Tent Revival

When I was seven or eight years old, around 1958, my Dad took the family to an old time tent revival. Upon arrival, out in the middle of a field was this huge tent tied down with stakes and ropes. Inside were rows of foldup chairs with a podium at the front. Surrounding the tent were a menagerie of vehicles such as: Hudsons, Packards, DeSotos, Studebakers, Oldsmobiles, and International pickup trucks. It was the middle of summer and it was hot! As folks began to gather in the open air tent, the service commenced to begin. Conducting the service was my mother's older brother, Bill Williams. Now Uncle Bill was what one might call a "walking contradiction, partly truth and partly fiction!" He was a part time preacher who sang and played guitar. These tent revivals would sometimes continue for two or three weeks, seven days a week! Men would arrive wearing straw hats and starched white shirts tucked inside faded bib overalls, while the ladies would wear little round pillbox hats with half veil, clip-on earrings, pop beads, white cotton gloves, and cat-eye glasses. This was also a time when women wore dresses, cooked three meals a day and baked. Some of you older folks might can remember! There was always a table filled with homemade cakes, fresh baked pies, and garden fruits and vegetables. Now Uncle Bill was a hellfire and brimstone preacher and very demonstrative. He would hold his Bible up in his right hand and walk back and forth, sometimes shouting the scriptures and if the "congregates" became distracted, he would slam the Bible down on the pulpit and wake up the men and the children on the back row. Occasionally, some of the men folk would get up and go outside to smoke. Some would go out to their cars and pull a batwing from under the front seat and take a nip or two. Returning to their seat, they would be filled with the spirit or I might say, spirits! Now about Uncle Bill, when he was a young boy, his Aunt Rose gave him his first guitar. Bill

was two years older than my Mom and they had four younger sisters. Granny played the pump organ and the French harp. Uncle Bill sang and played guitar and the "Five Williams Sisters" would often times be asked to sing at the Unity Baptist Church in Cavins, a small community between Walnut Grove and Woodruff. Living in abject poverty in a share cropper's house in the middle of a cotton field in the 20's and 30's gave little opportunity for advancement. Mom told me that the farmers would let them glean the fields after the pickers went through, giving them the scrap cotton left behind. But this was not like Ruth and Boaz, for nothing extra was left behind. One day, Mama, Granny and Bill were in the field picking a double row, dragging the long cotton sacks behind them and when they got to the end of the row, they turned around and Bill had dropped his cotton sack and lit out! A couple of months went by when Granny got a post card from Bill. He was cowboy-ing in Texas on a ranch! Meanwhile, back at the Tent Revival, as I said before, it was HOT! The handheld paper fans were all a flutter. The congregates were in the Spirit! Uncle Bill had reached his crescendo, then his voice became calm just as the opening notes of "Just As I Am" were being played by the fat lady on the upright piano. "Softly and Tenderly Jesus is calling, calling, Oh Sinner, come home!" It was time for the altar call! After several pleads from the pulpit, old folks and children came down and knelt while the heathens weren't ready to give up on sin. Uncle Bill later pursued a musical career and cut a few recordings in Nashville. He lived in Augusta, GA for several years and had that low country accent like Governor Fritz Hollings. I'll always remember his baritone voice and those Stetson hats. In his later years, he and his band would play smaller local venues like the Shrine Club and the VFW,

having served in the Army in WWII.

Tragically, Uncle Bill died in a house fire while sleeping. I will always remember that special bond he had with my Mother.
