### MISSION STATEMENT OF NAZARETH PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

*To worship and glorify God and to make disciples for Christ.*

*Dear Nazareth Family,*

*Although Lent and Easter are late this year, it seems as if we just celebrated Christmas. Lent is my favorite season on the Christian calendar because it is void of all the commercialism of Advent and Christmas. If you are new to the Reformed tradition or just need a refresher—Lent is the season of 40 days, from Ash Wednesday until Easter—that we spend preparing for Easter Sunday. It is a time of prayer, fasting and self-examination and lasts 40 days to commemorate the time of the flood in Genesis, Moses' sojourn at Mount Sinai, Elijah's journey to Mount Horeb, Jonah's call to Nineveh to repent and Jesus' time of testing in the wilderness. In the early church, Lent was a time of preparation for the celebration of baptism at the Easter Vigil.*

*While some faiths observe a Holy Lent by giving up something - wine, chocolate, procrastinating, etc., we do not. I always like to add something, as I highlighted in the Wonderful Wednesday Words.*

*This year, I will be preaching a sermon series entitled "Leaning Towards the Light," focusing on our need for the light and life that Jesus brings us. Although Lent is somewhat dark and introspective in nature, I felt a need for light after 2024. It is my prayer that the sermons will help us soak up the presence of Jesus. During our Lenten Bible studies, beginning March 12, I will teach a series on light-seekers. These will be Biblical characters who lean into the light of Jesus as well. I hope you will join us for all the special services and Bible studies. May our church family be encouraged to simply allow leaning towards Jesus and soaking up his presence to be "enough" during the season and take encouragement from this set of unlikely characters who positioned themselves to grow towards the light.*

## Session Minutes

### Approvals:

- Approved amended motion from Worship Committee to set Communion dates for 2025: Sunday January 5, February 2, March 2, April 6, May 4, June 1, July 6, August 3, September 7, October 5, November 2, and Thursday, April 17 (Maundy Thursday), Wednesday, December 24 (Christmas Eve).
- Approved motion from Admin Committee for \$720 Dyal Fund Grant for Christian Education to host a certified CPR class for leaders and a non-certified class for family and friends.
- Approved motion from Admin Committee for \$700 Dyal Fund Grant for Fellowship to offer a Beginner Pickleball Clinic to members and non-members. The format is patterned after another Church's successful implementation.
- Approved motion (Yarborough/Hoenig) for Julie to be on 6-week Sabbatical leave June 2-July 14. Julie will preach June 1 and return to the office July 14. Rev. Pressley Cox will cover during the Sabbatical leave.

### Other Items:

- Dyal funds are currently available for use. Committee chairs are reminded to submit requests for funds ASAP.
- The BG&S subcommittee is working on the bathroom renovation project. Discussion of Parlor renovation is also in progress.
- \$1450 was donated to the Souper Bowl of Caring offering. The Youth voted to send our donation to The Carpenter's Table.
- The Bake Auction raised \$7,230. Thank you to everyone for your generosity and support of our Youth.
- Friends & Family CPR training is on Wednesday, Feb. 19. THE CPR certification training is February 24. Will ask about a possible grant from Spartanburg Regional for AED equipment.
- Amy is working on plans for a possible Mission Trip to assist with Hurricane Helene Recovery in Montreat/Black Mountain. Tentative date is August 4-8. More details to follow.
- Julie received a lovely email from a visitor who attended a service in response to the Postcard mailout suggested by the Legacy Partnership team.

## “ROADS”

In the early days, roads were no more than Indian trails and animal paths. They usually ran alongside a river or a tributary of water. The first settlers followed the creeks and rivers up the Congaree, the Santee, the Combahee, the Enoree, the Broad and the Tygers to their destinations in the back country of the Carolinas, securing their land grants and establishing their homes among the old growth of virgin forest. Eventually, the paths became well-worn horse and wagon roads as more settlers arrived. It has been said that one of the earliest known roads in this area was the Old Georgia Road, which meandered in the direction of Greenwood and on to Augusta, Georgia, similar to the course of the current Highway 221. The other is the Blackstock Road, which was originally a cattle path that started near current Landrum, and ended at the Blackstock Plantation, named for the Blackstock family, at which there was a Patriot Victory over the British in 1781. Many Militia men resting in Nazareth cemetery participated in that and other battles including Cedar Springs, Musgrove Mill, Cowpens and Kings Mountain.

In an early survey of the original eight acres belonging to Nazareth Presbyterian Church, there is a plat of land describing the Meeting House, the burial ground, the Spring and the “Wagon Road” that passes by the property dated August 3, 1786. That is the current Nazareth Church Road. Now the “Old Gap Roads” course ran in the direction of today’s highway 290 or Moore Duncan Road and continued into Gap Creek Road and on to Gowensville. The Howard Gap Road followed the direction through Inman to Campobello and on into Tryon, NC. Before there was a Reidville or a Reidville Road, this thoroughfare was called the Crawfordsville Road, named for Senator John Crawford, the Son of the famed Revolutionary soldier, Patrick Crawford, both of whom rest in Nazareth Cemetery. The bridge on the North Tyger was called the “Snoddy Bridge”, the one on the Middle Tyger on Anderson Mill Road was the “Barry Bridge” and on the South Tyger was the “Wakefield Bridge”.
