

MISSION STATEMENT OF NAZARETH PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

To worship and glorify God and to make disciples for Christ.

Dear Nazareth Family,

Most everyone has heard me say that my favorite birth narrative is found in the Gospel of John. “And the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us.” The original Hebrew would better be translated as “The Word was made flesh and pitched a tent among us.” Eugene Peterson says in The Message, “The Word became flesh and blood and moved into the neighborhood.” The point is this: we are created by a God who made us in the image of the Holy; we are redeemed by a savior who loves enough to come into the world and get to know us firsthand; we are sustained by a Spirit who empowers us to handle any challenge because of the earthly presence of Jesus. There is no better news that I can think of.

And there is no church family I would rather worship, experience, learn, serve and have fun with than the Nazareth church family. This congregation truly knows what it means to love one another as God loves us. I see it every day in the ways our disciples reach out to one another, pray for one another and truly care about the details of each others’ lives. I experience it in worship—even when we have to subdue our Holy Chaos—as visitors are welcomed and brothers and sisters wave or hug or shake hands or greet each other with a true spirit of gladness.

I see it in the children as they sit on the bench in the front of the sanctuary and listen soooooo attentively, or offer the words of the Affirmation of Faith or mouth the words of the benediction as I sing it. I see it in the youth as they worship and serve and learn and play together.

During Advent and Christmas, you can see it too! Our souls will be fed by the music of the choirs, the youth and the instrumentalists this Sunday during our Christmas Cantata. Our bellies will be fed at the Advent dinners each Wednesday. We have the opportunity to get to know each confirm-and during the Sunday School hour on December 12 and then welcome them as full members into the church later at worship. Our hearts will be fed when we share the gifts that are collected for the Angel Tree recipients and their families, also on the 12th, and later that afternoon as we enjoy our intergenerational caroling. All of this will lead us to worship the newborn King once again on Christmas Eve as we come together as a family to hear the word, sing the songs of our hearts and partake in the Holy Meal.

I am so grateful that John brought Jesus, the Christ child, out of the manger and into the world where he lives and loves among us.

November Session Highlights

- Approved request to hold Baptism service for Mason Barath and Lillie Underwood on December 12.
- Approved request to use Presbytery Virtual service for Nazareth on December 26th. There will be no in-person Worship Service or Sunday School on December 26th.
- Approved request to accept the proposed 2022 budget. Proposed budget will be amended to add back \$2,400 to external missions to support ministry work of Shalynn/Tyler Crawford. Amended budget will be distributed. The amended budget amount is \$351,434.
- Motion was made and seconded to return to allowing movement during passing of the peace. Motion was approved.

Other Items:

- Margie Dobbins gave a report from the 118th Stated Meeting of Foothills Presbytery.
- The retreat for the confirmation class is November 19/20.
- The confirmation class will join the church Sunday, December 12. There will be a special celebration/recognition time for the confirmants during the 9:30 Sunday School time on December 12.
- Intergenerational Caroling is Sunday, December 12 from 3-5:30 followed by pizza in the Fellowship Hall. We will have vans to use for this event.
- The 250th anniversary celebration is May 21-22, 2022. The planning task force will have their first meeting December 2.

We will not have communion Sunday, December 4 due to the Choir Cantata. We will have communion during the Christmas Eve Service December 24.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION CORNER

During Advent, the youth are discussing “*The Heart That Grew Three Sizes*” by Matt Rawle. Its about finding faith in the story of the Grinch. We all know the famous story: The Grinch hates Christmas with all the Whos’ singing, playing loud instruments, decorations etc. so, he devises a plan to steal the Whos’ Christmas. Once he does, he sits up on top of his mountain waiting to hear their cries, but instead hears singing and rejoicing. “*It came without ribbons! It came without tags! It came without packages, boxes or bags! And he puzzled three hours, till his puzzler was sore. Then the Grinch though of something he hadn’t before— Maybe Christmas,’ he thought, ‘doesn’t come from a store. 
The Soup Kitchen

Missions - The Carpenter's Table

Nazareth supports a local food bank called The Carpenter's Table, which distributes food to needy families in the community every Saturday. The Carpenter's Table is located next door to Tyger River Presbyterian Church, across the street from Walgreens in Duncan. One Saturday a month, Nazareth provides 100% of the workers for the operation. We are very lucky that the youth group consistently comes every month to help, but we are still sometimes a little short on volunteers. Our next date to serve is December 11th from 8:00AM - 12:00PM. A significant amount of the food TCT distributes is donated to the organization by Sam's Club of Spartanburg. Each Tuesday and Thursday, TCT sends two volunteers to Sam's at 9AM to pickup whatever items Sam's deems ready to donate. The volunteers generally use a pick-up truck, large SUV, or van to transport the food back to The Carpenter's Table where there will be additional volunteers helping to unload and sort the food. Some volunteers like to arrive earlier than 9AM and if the Sam's staff is available they will go ahead and get the food pulled for them.

When you arrive at Sam's receiving dock (back of the building where the trucks unload) you notify the Sam's Club receiving staff who you are and what you are there for and wait for them to call for the departments to bring their donations to receiving. Normally it takes about 10-15 mins for the food to be brought out. They will bring it out to the dock on pallets. The quantity can range from 1 pallet to 5 or more. Two or so pallets is typical. If the volunteer has a pick-up truck, the Sam's Club staff will just put the pallet in the back of the truck. Otherwise, the volunteers unload the boxes from the pallet and put them into their vehicles. This task does involve lifting boxes that can weigh as much as 50 lbs. each.

The Sam's pickup volunteer's primary role is to transport the food back to TCT and help unload it. The entire process usually is complete no later than 10:00 AM. So the commitment is from approximately 9-10AM one day per month on either a Tuesday or Thursday morning. We have a standing schedule of volunteers that fill these slots. Right now we are specifically seeking additional help on several days throughout the month. We can be flexible in trying to match schedules.

Safety Off-duty officer

Our church employs an off-duty deputy from the Spartanburg County Sheriff's Department for each Sunday service and at other functions when requested. The officer arrives on-site 30 minutes prior to the beginning of Sunday school, enters the building at the back (office) door, and tours the inside as well as the outside of our premises. He (she) then moves the vehicle to the driveway opposite the sanctuary main entrance and throughout the service observes the cemetery side of the sanctuary, the main entrance, and the courtyard and Fellowship Hall doors. The officer is equipped with a Nazareth radio and is in touch with two observers in the sanctuary as well as the nursery attendant throughout the service.

HISTORY....holidays as a child

The Holiday Season has always been one of my favorite times of year. The air is crisp, the leaves have turned; it's harvest time in the rural South, when the farmer receives the bounty from the fruits of his labor. A time of Thanksgiving, family, and celebration of the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. A time to reflect on another year gone by. I will not dwell on the troubles of the present; I prefer to reminisce of the blessings in the past.

Some of my fondest memories are of my mother's kitchen where I was nourished with home-made love as a child, waking up to the sound of coffee percolating in the old pot on the stove, the smell of fried fatback wafting through the house and watching Mama roll out dough and cut out biscuits with the top of a drinking glass. The smells and the aroma of the breakfast meal being prepared was met with great anticipation. It was simple food, but special to me because of the author of its creation. Being outside meant being in the woods, shuffling through the leaves while the warm sun shines down through the trees. The smell of someone burning firewood, spooking an unexpectant deer, muscadines and scuppernongs, catching crawfish and hellgrammies in the creek. A boychild, free from worry. Setting out rabbit gums in the broom straw fields and taking a nap in the sun. First frost was hog killing time. My dad once brought home a half of a hog, put it in an old steamer trunk and covered it with salt. Mother had a black cast iron skillet in which she made the best pone of yellow cornbread, and it seemed like there was always a pot of pintos simmering on the back burner back in the kitchen for supper time. Mom managed to make a meal with very little to work with. Salmon patties with rice and gravy, country ham with biscuits and redeye gravy, fried porkchops, black-eyed peas with turnip greens. On our birthdays, we always got a homemade chocolate cake, 3-layer. Even after we were grown, sometimes she would make a very moist 2-layer pineapple coconut cake. For a weekday treat, Mom would make a plate of fudge and keep it in the refrigerator. At the time, I didn't realize the amount of work and sacrifice that mother gave to us. Always putting herself last in her devotion to our little family. I wish that she was here so that I could tell her that I am grateful and that I love her. Sundays, we always had fried chicken. Mother would cut up a whole chicken and distribute it to us at the table. I might get a wing or a leg, maybe the pulley bone, but Daddy always got the big piece of chicken!
