### MISSION STATEMENT OF NAZARETH PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

*To worship and glorify God and to make disciples for Christ.*

*Dear Friends,*

*Lent is my favorite season of the Christian year. This may seem odd to you because it is associated with repentance, fasting and prayer—some of which can seem rather solemn. But it is so much slower and more personal than Advent that I actually seem to celebrate it more thoroughly. Also, Lent does not have all the commercial trappings of Christmas.*

*I think the thing that makes Lent so beautiful is that it includes both joy and sacrifice. Some of you have heard me say that joy is the fruit of the Spirit that I find the most illusive. But when I TAKE THE TIME, which of course is one of the main points of Lent (think deliberate, contemplative, solitary) to dig deep into my soul and consider what Jesus did willingly for every child of God, joy overwhelms me.*

*Since the Session has named 2026 as The Year of Prayer, our Wednesday night Bible studies will focus on prayer. Instead of just the conventional types of prayer, we will be practicing some more creative, “out of the box” kinds of prayer.*

*On Wednesday, March 4, Nancy Hughes will lead us in dedicating our newly finished “Prayer Room.” This will give everyone who comes to Bible study that night a chance to listen to the plans for the Prayer Room as well as for the rest of the year as a congregation. Above all, I think Lent helps us, more than any other season, to consider what it really means to “pick up our cross” and follow Jesus.*

- Approved motion (Oates/Whitfield) to elect Vickie Gray to serve as Clerk of Session for a 1-year term to expire March 2027.

## Other Items

- \$1,882 was raised for the Souper Bowl of Caring offering. The funds will be given to The Soup Kitchen.
- The Bake Auction raised \$7,465 for our Youth. Many thanks to everyone who came out in the rainy weather and to all the bakers/bidders/buyers who helped make this fundraiser so successful. Also, a huge thanks to Amy Jackson and the Youth parents, Chuck Holmes and his kitchen minions and many others for the hard work on this event.
- Our Wednesday night Lenten Bible Study begins Wednesday, February 25 and runs 5 weeks, ending on March 25. Meals will be served at 5:30. The cost for meals is \$10/person with a \$25 cap on families of 3 or more. The study begins at 6:00 and ends at 6:45. The series topic is prayer. Sign up sheet for meals is in the Fellowship Hall.
- Dedication of the Prayer Room is scheduled for Wednesday, March 4, as part of the Wednesday night Bible Study. Plans for incorporating the Prayer Room into the Year of Prayer at Nazareth are being finalized.
- A trip to the Billy Graham Library is being planned for Monday, April 13. Cost will be \$30/person for the chartered bus. Admission to the Library is free but donations are welcomed. 60 tickets are available. Each person will pay for their lunch (or bring their own). The sign-up sheet will be in the Fellowship Hall.
- A Saint Patrick’s Day meal is planned March 15<sup>th</sup> following Worship. Fellowship will provide corned beef, and the congregation will be asked to bring side dishes.
- Rise Against Hunger is planned for Sunday, July 19, following Worship. This will be part of VBS. More details to come.
- Our Good Friday Tenebrae Service is Friday, April 3, at 7:00pm. We encourage you to bring a friend to this service.
- Foothills Presbytery will conduct Safety Training at Nazareth Saturday, March 21, from 8:30am-3:30pm. This training is also open to area Presbytery churches. See Rusty Kirkpatrick for more information.

Session was informed that contributions were significantly behind our expenses last year. Pledges for this year were also behind the proposed budget. While Nazareth is financially sound and we are blessed with a generous and giving congregation; operating at a deficit cannot be sustained long term. Discussions are currently underway on how to best address this issue.

**Rise Against Hunger** is a Non-Profit international hunger relief organization which Nazareth has supported twice so far in the past 4 years. In one afternoon our church can help package and get ready for shipment over 10,000 nutritious meals to be sent overseas to impoverished areas.

This year we will host the event on July 19, after church as a Kick-off to our annual Vacation Bible School. We will need as many volunteers as possible and indeed will reach out to the Scouts and other churches to help. Please mark this date on your calendars. Also we will need to raise about \$80,00 to make this event work. We already have \$3,500, and do have some options for grant writing for the program. Please keep this in mind as you consider charitable donations. Any donations for this cause should be made to Nazareth Presbyterian Church and earmarked for Rise Against Hunger.

## Saints and Begorrah! The St. Paddy's Day corned beef lunch is back!

On **March 15** after the church service, we will have a carry-in lunch in the Family Life Center to celebrate St. Patrick's Day. The Fellowship Committee will provide the corned beef. The members of the congregation are asked to provide traditional (or non-traditional) sides and/or desserts.

St. Patrick, a patron saint and missionary from Ireland, is credited with bringing Christianity to the pagan people of Ireland in the 5<sup>th</sup> century. To help them understand the Christian religion, especially the Trinity, he used the shamrock plant to teach them about this. **The top leaf represents the Father, the left leaf represents the Son, the right leaf represents the Holy Spirit, and the stem represents unity. Some say the three leaves represent Faith, Hope, and Love.**

Kate Moore Barry, one of the leading founders of our church, has Irish ties. Her parents were Irish immigrants who helped settle the Tyger River area. She is buried in our cemetery.

If you have never been to an Irish meal, please come! You will enjoy it!! A sign-up sheet has been placed in the Fellowship Hall along with traditional Irish dishes you may want to bring. Feel free to bring any dish, Irish or not!! Please sign up to come, whether you bring a dish or not. We need to know how much corned beef to prepare.

## From Buildings, Grounds and Safety:

### NARCAN

The Building, Grounds & Safety (BG&S) Committee has placed Narcan kits in the AED cabinets located in both the Family Life Center (FLC) and Fellowship Hall. Narcan is a nasal medication used to reverse the effects of an opioid overdose in emergency situations.

Under South Carolina's Good Samaritan Law, individuals who administer Narcan in good faith during a suspected overdose emergency are generally protected from civil liability. This protection helps ensure that life-saving assistance can be provided promptly while awaiting the arrival of emergency medical services.

# Congregation Disaster Preparedness Workshop

**Saturday, March 21st**

**9:00 am - 3:00 pm**

The Foothills Presbytery Disaster Commission (DPRC) is **encouraging every congregation to send leaders** to this workshop on Church Safety. This workshop, led by members of the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance National Response Team, will provide guidance for creating, enhancing and implementing Church Safety plans.

**Disaster Preparedness Planning** is essential for every PC(USA) congregation. For example, on average, 1,300 church fires occur in the U.S. each year.

Is your church prepared?

Do you have an evacuation plan?

Are your records secure?

Is your insurance sufficient?

When was the last assessment of your church building(s)?

The primary goal of a preparedness plan is to support the continued functioning of the presbytery, the congregation, and/or the family in the event of a disaster. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is offering a Congregational Preparedness Workshop. The intention of the workshop is to inform, educate, support, and motivate congregations, and families in developing and writing their individualized preparedness plans. Topics include forming a planning team, assessing planning needs, determining objectives and goals, developing the plan, and a path to approval and plan sharing.

This workshop is designed for church leaders (pastors, elders, deacons), facility staff, church officers, ushers/greeters, Sunday School and Bible Study leaders, church members, etc.
