## Cemetery's Imposing Task



In every detail, from the carefully mowed grass to the landscaped flowering entrance gates, our cemetery stands as more than a resting place—it is a tribute to perseverance, community, and remembrance. Here, the original settlers and all who followed, now rest surrounded by the community that remembers and cherishes them always.

It has been about 30 years since the stones, markers, and slabs have received thorough cleaning. Several of our members have now taken the initiative to address this imposing task. Ross McClellan and Bill Berry have been working since June cleaning stones in the Old Section of the cemetery. The Summer heat has been a two-edged sword for them. When the days heat up, they only have about three hours in the morning to work. However, the chemicals that are used require warm weather and rain to fully activate the cleaning

agents that are used. But their progress has been fantastic.

A cart with a sprayer, batteries, and reservoir was purchased to facilitate the work. It has served its purpose well and makes the work easier (not easy, but easier) and is stored in the garage of the manse. Ross has made sure that the batteries are charged for the pump and the cart's drive system.

The chemicals take time to work fully, but if you take a walk or even look at the Old Section from inside the sanctuary, the markers are becoming brilliant white. Many visitors have said that our cemetery is the best kept in the area. But this takes it to a whole new level. Give a thank-you to Bill and Ross. It is one more example of our congregation stepping up to maintain and preserve our campus.



# HISTORY

## Early measurement terms used by Pioneer Settlers

### These terms were also commonly used:

A firkin of butter, a stone of butcher's meat, a punch of prunes, and a fother of lead.

The Enoree River, a Cherokee word meaning "*River of Muscadines*" became the western boundary of Spartanburg or the Spartan district and the territorial boundary for settlement. The "*Saluda*" is translated as "*the Green Corn place*" or "*River of Corn*" from the Cherokee word '*Tsaludiy.*' '*Tucapau*' is a Cherokee word meaning "*Strong Cloth*" or "*Indian Weaver,*" and was a hunting ground between the North and Middle Tyger Rivers. "*Pacolet*" is also a Cherokee word that means "*Fast Running Horse.*"

When the early settlers came to the back country of SC, they found virgin forests with all sorts of game and wildlife. Upon observing a 'panther' or 'mountain lion' drinking from the river and being from Ireland and not having ever seen a big cat other than from pictures, they were identified as '*Tygers*' by those who witnessed them. Therefore aptly name "*the Tyger Rivers.*"

As a consequence of living in close proximity to and trading with Native Americans, settlers in the back country adopted many of treatments for disease espoused by the indigenous people. The forest and fields of the Southeast were a veritable pharmacy. The fresh, new leaves of Pokeweed, which appear in early spring, are rich in vitamins and minerals. As pokeweed matures, the limbs and leaves produce a toxic alkaloid which must not be eaten. The berries were sometimes used for wines and pies. "*Poke Sallit*" is still relished today by many in the South! Dogwood bark was made into tea, a bitter brew for treating fever and malaria.

'*Jimson weed*' was used by Native Americans as a poultice and applied to wounds to reduce pain, and smoke was used for treating bronchial problems and asthma. '*Sweet flag roots*' were used extensively by Native Americans and back country settlers alike to treat indigestion and flatulence as well as to promote health. So, I will end on that note!
