The Missions focus for January is the
[Feed the Future Backpack Ministry.](#)



This month we are collecting items for the Feed the Future backpack ministry. This is going to be a HUGE need this year, as we are delivering backpack meals for 23+ kids every week.

We will begin packing the Feed the Future backpacks soon.

We will need two fruit and two dinner options and one drink option for each gallon Ziplock bag.

Items needed: individual sized ravioli, spaghetti, soup, mac & cheese, applesauce, fruit cups, juice boxes, kool-aid and Capri Sun.

We also need gallon sized Ziplocks and we can always use fun items like: suckers, candy, raisins or gum.

Please no peanut butter, nuts, Vienna Sausage or Ramen noodles.

Thank you so much for helping us fill the backpacks each week.
Together we make a difference in the lives of these children.

To demonstrate how much of these we actually need, if there are 23 children, each gets 2 cans of ravioli (or soup) and 2 cups of applesauce or fruit each week, and there are 21 weeks in the school semester. $21 \text{ weeks} * 23 \text{ students} * 2 \text{ cans each} = 966 \text{ cans of ravioli (or soup)}$ we will need this semester and $966 \text{ cups of applesauce or fruit}$. That's a lot of cans and cups! Please consider buying and donating some of these items this month!
