Approvals:

- **Approved motion from Admin Committee to adopt the 2023 Budget. Budget total is \$349,619.63.**
- **Approved motion from BG&S Committee to move Boy Scouts back to Mission Committee.**
- **Approved motion from Christian Education Committee to use the curriculum “Talksheets” by David Lynn and Rick Davis for the Youth Sunday School class.**

Other Items:

- **Advent meals: November 30th, December 7th, December 14th. Meals begin at 6:00. Sign up on sheets in Fellowship Hall or Call Debby in the office.**
- **December 11 church wide caroling.**
- **All Angel Tree names have now been taken.**
- **Missions may be scheduling a meeting soon to talk about a possible trip to Eastern Kentucky to assist with rebuilding from the flooding in this area.**
- **We will have a Virtual Service only on Sunday, December 25.**
- **Discussed increasing hours for Amy Jackson due to her expanded responsibilities. Received another \$20,000 grant from the Spartanburg County Foundation for this position. The Personnel Committee will follow up with the Admin Committee and make a recommendation for approval by Session.**
- **Budget will be presented to the congregation as information at the January Congregational Meeting. Congregation will vote to approve the Pastor's Terms of Call.**
- **Mark Henry serves as liaison between church and Boy Scouts. Mark will attend Missions Committee meetings and the committee will also name a liaison between the committee and Mark. Shuan has also been added to the Constant Contact list to ensure a good flow of communication between the church and the Boy Scouts.**
- **Caldwell Cabin is being emptied and should be moved by the first of the year.**
- **Operation Christmas Child activity was very well received. May look at expanding/making this an annual activity.**
- **Advent Devotions will be sent electronically every day with at least 20 hard copies mailed to those who do not receive electronic communication.**
- **New elder training will be Saturday January 7. Session will examine elders Monday, January 16 with installation/ordination held on Sunday, January 22.**
- **Thank you to everyone who assisted with the service for Bob Hatchette and for the loving care given to Bob and Abby.**

Nazareth Presbyterian is packing "Feed the Future" bags for DR Hill Middle School starting December 1st. Our first delivery will be December 7th. In addition, on December 14th we will be delivering two weekend packs (a gallon Ziploc bag) and a family dinner along with a new backpack. We can add toothbrushes, toothpaste, socks, gloves, etc. to the December 14th bag if we'd like. We will have 20 children but that number can change. We will deliver on Wednesdays between 8:30 and 1:30. Items needed are listed below and Sam's or Costco are suggested for your purchases. A group of elves has already packed bags for several weeks but we will begin collecting items immediately in the bin in the Fellowship Hall. See pictures of the sample bags below so that you can see the sizes that are needed to fit in a gallon bag.

Items needed are: spaghetti, ravioli, chicken, roast beef, soups, individual mac and cheese, oatmeal, grits, pop tarts, individual fruit cups or applesauce, crackers, chips, cookies, granola bars, energy bars, fruit snacks, juice box, small water, small apple or orange juice, sport drink.
