He seeks to remind us the Scriptures are not given just so we will agree with the theological information found in Jesus' teachings but also to teach us how truly wise we can become when we live according to Jesus' summary of the Torah: to love God and to love our neighbors as ourselves.*

# History



## Drive-In Movies

*A cherished part of Americana was the drive-in movie, a place where families and friends could go to enjoy an evening under the stars within the confines of an automobile while watching their favorite movie through a windshield. Spartanburg had at least four that I can recall. There was the Star-lite*

*drive-in, the Scenic drive-in, the Circle drive-in on Reidville Road and the Moon-lite drive-in in Inman. They were pretty much set up the same, the giant marquee was next to the entrance, listing the movie titles and names of the leading actors, the ticket booth was illuminated and sat at the opening by the road and was usually occupied by the owner of the drive-in or his wife where they would collect admission and distribute tickets to the movie. Adult admission was one dollar and children under twelve were fifty cents. Once you drove inside, there were rows upon rows of parking spaces situated on a hump all sloping downward toward the screen. Each space was identified by a pole which supported two speakers, one on each side of the pole, which you would hang on a halfway rolled down window on the driver's side of the car. At the back of the parking lot was the concession stand, where you could buy hot buttered popcorn, cotton candy, French fries, hot dogs and fountain soft drinks. The projection booth was on top of the concession stand. At the bottom of the parking lot, in front of the screen, was a playground, with a swing set, a see-saw, monkey bars and a merry-go-round. Children would run and play on the grassy area until the stars came out, then return to the car to watch the movie. Sometimes we would bring pillows from our beds and lie on top of the car or on the hood. Being outside under the stars on a warm summer night was a special time. Before the movie began cartoon characters were projected on the screen, popcorn boxes with legs arms and a smiling face along with singing hot dogs and soda drinks would walk back and forth, stimulating your appetite and encouraging you to visit the stand for refreshment before the movie began. And, of course, there were teenagers! Sometimes, boys would sneak in the movie by hiding in the trunk of their friend's cars if they didn't have a dollar for admission. If they spotted someone from school who was on a date, they would circle around his car, grab hold of the fender wells and shake the car, then run away laughing, especially if the windows were fogged up! What can I say, teenagers are full of mischief! A triple feature would result in falling asleep with our pillows in the back seat. This was an enjoyable time in my life! It's unfortunate that folks no longer have the opportunity to experience it!*
