





- Margie Dobbins volunteered to serve as Commissioner for 127th Foothills Presbytery Meeting Tuesday, November 12 @John Knox Presbyterian Church.
- The Fall Festival is October 27 from 4-6. This event is the main fundraiser for our NazKids (the Spaghetti/Bake Auction is the fundraiser for our Youth).
