



SJLC's Career Workshop with a Professional Career Coach: Informed Consent

Student Leadership Johns Creek is partnering with Dr. Anne Imhoff to offer our second-year students a special one-time workshop on career interests and decision making. The object of the workshop is to allow students to take a well-validated occupational interest assessment and receive feedback on career and academic subjects of particular interest.

Anne Imhoff, Ph.D.

Originally from New York, Dr. Imhoff is a licensed psychologist in private practice in Duluth, GA. Her practice focuses on personality and leadership assessment in educational and occupational transitions.

Dr. Imhoff has 20 years of experience in cognitive and personality assessment. She uses psychological assessments to create a comprehensive understanding of personality, occupational interests, core values and leadership style, then works with clients to identify career and educational options that would be most congruent and satisfying for them over the long and short term. Dr. Imhoff works to develop strategic career options for high performing managers, executives and enterprise leaders. Dr. Imhoff also works extensively with the United Methodist Church on personality and leadership assessment for their candidates for ordination.

Dr. Imhoff earned her undergraduate degree in psychology and English from Amherst College, and her doctorate in counseling psychology from the State University of New York, at Albany in 1998. Her doctoral research focused on assessment variables that predict long-term job satisfaction for adults. Dr. Imhoff also completed a neuropsychological assessment residency at Georgia State University, and eventually became the director of the Regents Center for Learning Disorders (a neuropsychological training clinic for psychology graduate students at GSU). SLJC Career Exploration Workshop

Students in the second-year class will receive an online assessment (Strong Interest Inventory) prior to the in-person workshop. We will have a group feedback (with each student accessing their own test results) in an SLJC meeting to review the assessment results. Each student will receive a digital copy of their own results and participate in group exercises based on their data.

Strong Interest Inventory – College Edition

This inventory (or "test") helps high school and college students identify areas of academic and career interest. It uses data about their preferences and interests to help them explore potential college courses, majors, internships, and part time jobs. It also informs them about *specific* occupations and the educational requirements for access to occupations. The test takes most people 30 minutes to complete. *There are no fees for the students in SLJC to participate in this test or feedback session.* (However, if more information, a more detailed individual interpretation, or further career counseling is desired, you may contact Dr. Imhoff for further services at a fee.)

Minors

Because many of the second-year students in SLJC are under the age of 18, we are asking the permission of a parent or guardian to administer the Strong Interest Inventory. This is a career counseling type of test and does not ask questions of an overly personal nature.

Confidentiality

The information students provide is confidential and will be protected to the fullest extent provided under the law. Students' data will not be released or discussed with any other persons outside of SLJC, though the students themselves are encouraged to share the data with their parents.
