An Ordinance recommended by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment establishing an Impacted Tenants' Fund to protect tenants in St. Louis City who are forced to relocate from their rental unit due to condemnation for occupancy due to the landlord's failure to maintain the rental unit in conformance with code requirements; and reappropriating a portion of the funds received under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Section 9901, Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Act (the "Act") and previously appropriated by **Ordinance 71393** to the Impacted Tenants' Fund; directing the funds collected from the enforcement of Building Code violations to the Impacted Tenants' Fund annually and appropriating such funds for a program of distribution to eligible tenants; and containing a severability clause and an emergency clause.

1 An Ordinance recommended by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment establishing an 2 Impacted Tenants' Fund to protect tenants in St. Louis City who are forced to relocate from their 3 rental unit due to condemnation for occupancy due to the landlord's failure to maintain the rental 4 unit in conformance with code requirements; and reappropriating a portion of the funds received 5 under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Section 9901, Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Act (the "Act") and previously appropriated by **Ordinance Number 71393** to the 6 7 Impacted Tenants' Fund; directing the funds collected from the enforcement of Building Code 8 violations to the Impacted Tenants' Fund annually and appropriating such funds for a program of 9 distribution to eligible tenants; and containing a severability clause and an emergency clause. 10 WHEREAS, an estimated 56 percent of St. Louis residents are renters; and 11 WHEREAS, a condemnation for occupancy as enforced by the Building Division requires the 12 forced relocation of any tenants residing in the unit; and 13 WHEREAS, tenants who are forced to relocate as a result of the landlords' failure to maintain a rental dwelling unit in conformance with code requirements may be required to put down a 14 15 security deposit to transition to new housing, and may not be able to secure the return of their previous security deposit from a negligent landlord in a timely manner; and 16 17 WHEREAS, a security deposit is typically equivalent to the amount of one-month's rent; and 18 WHEREAS, the City of St. Louis has received Four Hundred Ninety-Eight Million Seventy-Six 19 Thousand Fifty-Four Dollars (\$498,076,054.00) from the Federal Government pursuant to the 20 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. Pub. L. No. 117-2, § 9901 (the "ARPA Funds"); and 21 WHEREAS, the City appropriated ARPA Funds in several ordinances including Ordinance 22 **Number 71393**; and

- 11 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS AS FOLLOWS:
- 12 **SECTION ONE.** Definitions.
- 13 "Code Official" shall have the same meaning as defined in Section 25.56.020.
- 14 "Condemnation for occupancy" or "condemned" is an order issued by the Code Official
- prohibiting persons from occupying and being present on the premises of a specified dwelling
- due to building code violations until such violations have been addressed and the order is
- 17 rescinded.
- 18 "Eligible Tenant" is a tenant of a rental dwelling unit who is forced to relocate due to
- 19 condemnation for occupancy of such dwelling unit due to the landlord's failure to maintain the
- 20 rental unit in conformance with code requirements.
- 21 "Impacted Tenants' Fund" is a fund established and managed by the City to provide a program
- of financial assistance to Eligible Tenants.

- 1 "Tenant" shall mean a resident of the City who legally occupies a rental dwelling unit with the
- 2 property owner's consent, and is obligated to pay rent.
- 3 **SECTION TWO.** Establishment of the Impacted Tenants' Fund.
- 4 The Comptroller of the City of St. Louis is hereby authorized and directed to establish a special
- 5 account to be known as the Impacted Tenants' Fund in which certain funds as described in this
- 6 ordinance shall be deposited. The Impacted Tenants' Fund shall be kept separate and apart from
- 7 all other funds, and all interest generated on deposited funds shall accrue to the Impacted
- 8 Tenants' Fund. All funds in the Impacted Tenants' Fund are appropriated to the Department of
- 9 Human Services. The Director of the Department of Human Services is hereby authorized to
- make, negotiate, and execute all contracts or other documents on behalf of the City to expend
- such funds for reasonable administrative costs and to distribute such funds to Eligible Tenants.
- All contract agreements shall be subject to applicable City ordinances, policies, and procedures
- 13 governing City contracts. The Comptroller is authorized and directed to issue warrants upon the
- 14 City Treasury for payment of all expenditures authorized in this ordinance provided that such
- warrants do not exceed the total amount of funds appropriated by this ordinance.
- 16 **SECTION THREE.** Eligible Tenants may receive financial assistance through the Impacted
- 17 Tenants' Fund on a first-come-first-serve basis, subject to funding availability. The Director of
- 18 the Department of Human Services is authorized to implement rules for approval of applications
- 19 for assistance upon approval of such rules by the Housing, Urban Development and Zoning
- 20 Committee. Each Eligible Tenant whose application is approved will receive financial assistance
- 21 equal to one month's rent based on the fair market rent for apartments of the same size or type as
- 22 the one the Eligible Tenant is being forced to relocate from, as determined by the U.S.

EXHIBIT 2

Direct Cash Assistance for the American Rescue Plan Act Funds

Section I: Purpose

A. Direct Cash Assistance (DCA) is to be used to provide funds to St. Louis City residents who have had a negative financial impact due to the COVID-19 Pandemic and do not exceed 80% of Area Median Income (AMI).

Sections II: Total Disbursement & Anticipated Impact

- A. The St. Louis Treasurer's Office will oversee the equitable and efficient disbursement of \$5,000,000 of ARPA funds to St. Louis City residents. Disbursements will be made in the amount of \$500 serving about 10,000 residents.
- B. Funds will be targeted for St. Louis City residents who do not exceed 80% of the AMI as shown in **Table A**, and who meet the eligibility requirements set out in Section IV
- C. No more than 7 percent of the total funds can be used for administrative costs such as application processing.

Section III: Application Process

- A. Individuals must complete an online or paper application to submit personal and demographic information. Applicants will also have to provide proof of identity, income, dependent/dependency status, household size, household income, residency within the City of St. Louis, and proof of economic hardship. The application will outline acceptable forms of proof.
- B. For those without access to technology, a series of application completion events with partners across the City of St. Louis for residents will be held to assist residents in completing applications. The first application event will be held in one of the city's Qualified Census Tracts and will occur within two weeks of passage of this ordinance. For the first thirty days that the funds are available, at least fifteen percent of the total funds will be reserved for applicants that applied at an application event.
- C. Applicants will be notified by mail, by phone and/or by text message of approval and receive a unique pick-up ID and pickup location as outlined in Section VI
- D. Applicants will also be connected with resources from the St. Louis Office of Financial Empowerment

Section IV: Eligibility Requirements

A. Resident of the City of St. Louis for a minimum of 12 months.

- B. At least 18 years of age (or have been able to be claimed) as a dependent for tax year 2020.
- C. Priority shall be given to Head of Households in Qualified Census Tracts with dependents
- D.. Proof of economic hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic including, but not limited to:
 - 1. Job loss (laid off, furloughed, reduced hours)
 - 2. Unpaid time off due to quarantining or lingering effects of COVID-19
 - 3. Inability to work due to lack and/or loss of childcare
 - 4. Increase in childcare expenses
 - 5. Funeral expenses due to COVID-19 related death
 - 6. Unplanned out-of-pocket medical expenses due to COVID-19 complications
 - 7. Reduction in stimulus payment due to child support

Section V: Special Circumstances

- A. Undocumented St. Louisans:
 - 1. The undocumented population in the City of St. Louis will be eligible to receive direct assistance. We understand that this population may not feel comfortable disclosing

information or interacting with governmental entities, and thus we will distribute funds through partners who have a 501(c)3 status and regularly work with these populations.

Special guidelines for undocumented residents are as follows:

i. Eligibility requirements will be the same as outlined in **Section IV**

and Table A.

- ii. Applications will be completed through the 501(C)3 partner and for those who are granted a disbursement, data on satisfaction of eligibility requirements will be sent to the STLTO with unique alphanumerical IDs (instead of names) to protect the confidentiality of the applicants
- B. Unhoused Residents
 - 1. The homeless population in the City of St. Louis will be eligible to receive direct assistance. Special guidelines for unhoused residents are as follows:
 - i. Proof of homeless status which we will determine in alignments with those provided by state. (See:

https://health.mo.gov/seniors/resources/pdf/housing-eligibility-dmh.pdf)

- ii. Proof of economic hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic as outlined in **Section IV**.
 - iii. Entity sponsor through homeless assistance and/or outreach organization/program (shelter, center, church, etc.) along with cooperation from the Dept. of Human Services/Homeless Services Division (HSD) for the City of St. Louis.

A. Debit Card

- All disbursements will be placed on a secure, fee free, pin-protected debit card for St. Louis residents.
- Residents will be able to pick up cards from up to seven (7) accessible partner locations across the St. Louis metro area. Confirmations will be communicated once applications are approved
 - Residents shall present their ID at one of the seven (7) pickup locations to receive their card.
 - Residents will be provided with financial empowerment materials prior to the disbursement of funds, and invited to participate in a financial empowerment course.
 - Program may shall allow for direct deposit options.
- B. Program shall also allow for direct deposit options

Section VII: Evaluation Plan

A. The Department of Human Services will work with local universities and a technical assistance partner to study the impact of the program's effectiveness and program design in efforts to improve efficacy.

EXHIBIT 2

Direct Cash Assistance for the American Rescue Plan Act Funds

Section I: Purpose

A. Direct Cash Assistance (DCA) is to be used to provide funds to St. Louis City residents who have had a negative financial impact due to the COVID-19 Pandemic and do not exceed 80% of Area Median Income (AMI).

Sections II: Total Disbursement & Anticipated Impact

- A. The St. Louis Treasurer's Office will oversee the equitable and efficient disbursement of \$5,000,000 of ARPA funds to St. Louis City residents. Disbursements will be made in the amount of \$500 serving about 10,000 residents.
- B. Funds will be targeted for St. Louis City residents who do not exceed 80% of the AMI as shown in **Table A**, and who meet the eligibility requirements set out in Section IV
- C. No more than 7 percent of the total funds can be used for administrative costs such as application processing.

Section III: Application Process

- A. Individuals must complete an online or paper application to submit personal and demographic information. Applicants will also have to provide proof of identity, income, dependent/dependency status, household size, household income, residency within the City of St. Louis, and proof of economic hardship. The application will outline acceptable forms of proof.
- B. For those without access to technology, a series of application completion events with partners across the City of St. Louis for residents will be held to assist residents in completing applications. The first application event will be held in one of the city's Qualified Census Tracts and will occur within two weeks of passage of this ordinance. For the first thirty days that the funds are available, at least fifteen percent of the total funds will be reserved for applicants that applied at an application event.
- C. Applicants will be notified by mail, by phone and/or by text message of approval and receive a unique pick-up ID and pickup location as outlined in Section VI
- D. Applicants will also be connected with resources from the St. Louis Office of Financial Empowerment

Section IV: Eligibility Requirements

A. Resident of the City of St. Louis for a minimum of 12 months.

- B. At least 18 years of age (or have been able to be claimed) as a dependent for tax year 2020.
- C. Priority shall be given to Head of Households in Qualified Census Tracts with dependents
- D.. Proof of economic hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic including, but not limited to:
 - 1. Job loss (laid off, furloughed, reduced hours)
 - 2. Unpaid time off due to quarantining or lingering effects of COVID-19
 - 3. Inability to work due to lack and/or loss of childcare
 - 4. Increase in childcare expenses
 - 5. Funeral expenses due to COVID-19 related death
 - 6. Unplanned out-of-pocket medical expenses due to COVID-19 complications
 - 7. Reduction in stimulus payment due to child support

Section V: Special Circumstances

- A. Undocumented St. Louisans:
 - 1. The undocumented population in the City of St. Louis will be eligible to receive direct assistance. We understand that this population may not feel comfortable disclosing

information or interacting with governmental entities, and thus we will distribute funds through partners who have a 501(c)3 status and regularly work with these populations.

Special guidelines for undocumented residents are as follows:

i. Eligibility requirements will be the same as outlined in **Section IV**

and Table A.

- ii. Applications will be completed through the 501(C)3 partner and for those who are granted a disbursement, data on satisfaction of eligibility requirements will be sent to the STLTO with unique alphanumerical IDs (instead of names) to protect the confidentiality of the applicants
- B. Unhoused Residents
 - 1. The homeless population in the City of St. Louis will be eligible to receive direct assistance. Special guidelines for unhoused residents are as follows:
 - i. Proof of homeless status which we will determine in alignments with those provided by state. (See:

https://health.mo.gov/seniors/resources/pdf/housing-eligibility-dmh.pdf)

- ii. Proof of economic hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic as outlined in **Section IV**.
 - iii. Entity sponsor through homeless assistance and/or outreach organization/program (shelter, center, church, etc.) along with cooperation from the Dept. of Human Services/Homeless Services Division (HSD) for the City of St. Louis.

A. Debit Card

- All disbursements will be placed on a secure, fee free, pin-protected debit card for St. Louis residents.
- Residents will be able to pick up cards from up to seven (7) accessible partner locations across the St. Louis metro area. Confirmations will be communicated once applications are approved
 - Residents shall present their ID at one of the seven (7) pickup locations to receive their card.
 - Residents will be provided with financial empowerment materials prior to the disbursement of funds, and invited to participate in a financial empowerment course.
 - Program may shall allow for direct deposit options.
- B. Program shall also allow for direct deposit options

Section VII: Evaluation Plan

A. The Department of Human Services will work with local universities and a technical assistance partner to study the impact of the program's effectiveness and program design in efforts to improve efficacy.
