## Class Hope

## Class Faith

The class seems to eagerly plant seeds of thought and discussion, regularly watering their spirituality with a nourishment of fellowship and bible study. This week, we delved a bit deeper into why parables serve as such a memorable way to remember God's layered stories of "instructions for the good life" within the Bible. The Book of Matthew's Sower of the Seed and Wheat and Weeds reminded us that however tempted we feel to judge others by their actions and determine the "followers" and "unfollowers," that determination isn't something for us, the hard working harvesters, to do in order to be closer to God. The Farmer at the end of the day is the only one who can really tell the weeds from the wheat and the final judgement belongs to only one God. Too easily, we can throw out the wheat with the weeds, no matter how they were planted in the first place. After a heated, but super fun game of "the floor is lava," we planted actual seeds in a compostable pot and discussed how we each nourish our faith in our daily lives. Like the plant, we need light and love and hydration for our souls in order to grow our best selves. **Teacher Suzanne**

**SUNDAY SCHOOL INFORMATION:** Sunday School takes place during the 10am service. Our classes are divided according to grade levels: PreK to 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade is Class Hope and 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> Grade is Class Faith. The curriculum for **Class Hope** is based on Godly Play, a Montessori-based curriculum built on the premise that children want to know God rather than know about God. In the careful telling of stories, and sharing of questions, adults help children develop a language to express what they already know about God. (And in the process, adults learn something, too). The class meets in the Fireside Room. **Class Faith** adapts the Episcopal curriculum *Weaving God's Promises for Children*, connecting worship and Sunday School. It is a comprehensive, Bible-based Sunday school curriculum designed for children to journey through the Bible with key stories from the Old and New Testaments.
