Ephesians 6:2-3 “Honor your father and mother” is the first commandment with a promise ‘so that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth.’”

As the children arrived, they made cards for their mothers that included a message of ‘I love it when you...’ Our bible study included discussion about why do you think the very first commandment is about honoring our parents? A few children equated parenting to God’s own work of caring and nurturing creation. Other children mentioned that if you can’t learn to respect the ones that make the most sacrifices for you, how will you respect other people in your life? It was a deep and meaningful look at how we treat others.

We then moved on to a True and False segment of ‘honoring’ a parent. If your mother makes you dinner and you eat it all but you complain the whole time about how you don’t prefer it, is that still honoring your mother? The answers transformed into quite the debate! Apparently the eating is the honoring but the message of how much you don’t like the food is very important so that mom ‘will think twice before making that meal again.’
