## **New England - Germany Energy Transition Forum**

The GACC NY was a major organizer of the New England-Germany Energy Transition Forum this week at **Harvard Law School**, courtesy of the **Environmental and Energy Law Program**.

Hosted by the <u>Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EEA)</u> in partnership with the <u>German Federal Ministry for Economic Affairs and Energy (BMWi)</u>, the forum was an opportunity for officials from government, industry and academia to discuss shared energy challenges, pursue urgent action on climate change mitigation, integrate lessons learned in Germany and New England and incorporate best practices.

Industry leaders from both countries discussed recent developments and challenges in energy transition, including the rapid increase of renewables, power sector decarbonisation, heating sector innovation, clean transportation and offshore wind.
