- Increasing collaboration and awareness around CVI

Outcomes – Impact

Short to Mid-term

- Expand # of students receiving CVI assessments and individualized CVI-specific education plans
- Decrease the time between diagnosis of CVI and intervention
- Improve CVI range scores from year to year so a child can gain or retain a significant amount of their functional vision
- Integrate CVI-accessible materials & instruction into all OSB classrooms
- Publish academic research; share results at state, national and international conferences
- Partnerships with medical specialists to provide medical/functional diagnosis

Long-term

- Access to CVI assessment and intervention for those who need one
- CVI interventions resulting in increased independence, life readiness and self-advocacy long term
- Increased awareness around CVI
- Accessible resources for instruction of children with CVI
- CVI assessment and intervention innovations replicated, helping visually impaired everywhere
- Bolster partnerships b/t medical community and OSB to achieve/foster better patient/student outcomes
