



HOW TO GET A LIBRARY CARD

Any resident of the Cheboygan Area Public Library District may have a CAPL Library card free of charge. The Library District covers the City of Cheboygan, and the Townships of Aloha, Beaugrand, Benton, Grant, Inverness, and portions of Hebron and Munro. Guest cards are available for anyone who resides outside of the district for an annual fee of \$50 per household.

To sign up for a card, bring a proof of your local address to the Library (mail, tax record, driver's license, etc.) and fill out a short form. Within minutes, your new card will be registered and ready to use!



YOUR LIBRARY CARD WORKS AT THESE LIBRARIES!

CAPL is a member of the PAC2 consortium, which is a group of area libraries that share resources. That means that you can use your CAPL card at these other libraries: Petoskey District Library, Charlevoix Area Public Library, Presque Isle District Libraries (Roger's City, Onaway, Posen, Millersburg, Grand Lake), Alcona County Libraries (Harrisville, Mikado, Lincoln, Caledonia), Crooked Tree District Libraries (Boyne Falls, Walloon), Mackinaw Area Public Libraries (Mackinaw, Pellston, Bliss), Boyne District Library, Montmorency County Libraries (Atlanta, Hillman, Lewiston), and Tahquamenon Area Library.

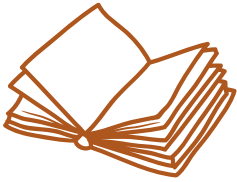

ON-SITE RESOURCES



CAPL holds more than 63,000 books, audiobooks, dvds, and cds (plus several newspapers & magazines)!



Multiple desktop computers are available for patron use as well as free 24-hr Wi-Fi. Printing and copying services are available for .15 cents per page (b/w only).



CAPL offers local history and genealogy research resources through local newspapers in microfilm form, Michigan History Magazine online, books of local interest, and genealogical research files. Research tools through the Michigan E-Library's databases are also available.

CAPL offers more than 27,000 items through digital services, which include Up North Digital-Overdrive (Libby) for e-books, downloadable audiobooks, e-magazines, plus films through Kanopy!

MEL



The Michigan eLibrary, or MeL, is a service of the Library of Michigan that helps libraries around the state share resources. MeL has two parts: there is the MeL Catalog for physical items that can be borrowed from other libraries and the E-Library for digital resources such as databases, e-journals, and resources such as Consumer Reports, ERIC, Explora, Encyclopedias, and more.

CAPL's Library of Things collection has been growing! It now includes more than 80 games, some of which are for outdoors such as cornhole, yard Yahtzee, and badminton. The collection also includes a crock-pot, bread maker, food dehydrator, and ice-cream maker; plus, fishing poles, ukuleles, art stamps, garden seeds, and Wi-Fi hotspots.

Study spaces and community meeting rooms are available to the public. The Library also hosts several programs and classes throughout the year!

MAKERSPACE



Expansion into unique tools is underway! CAPL now hosts a 3-D printer, a Cricut Cutter, and plans are moving forward for other Makerspace supplies and classes.
