

**Summary of
Paulist Center
Pastoral Council
Reentry Survey
Results**

Summer, 2020

Overall Impressions

- * 29.7% of respondents are in favor of reentry in August, while 37.2% are in favor of resuming in-person Masses later in the year, and 33.1% are in favor of waiting until everyone in the community can safely worship together.
- * The data shows that 22.3% (33 individuals) would be either somewhat or very likely to attend Mass, and 69.6% (103 individuals) would be unlikely or very unlikely to attend.
- * Those who are likely to attend mainly expressed a desire to be with the community in-person and/or to receive the Eucharist. The preference for Mass time is fairly evenly split between the 5pm and 10am.

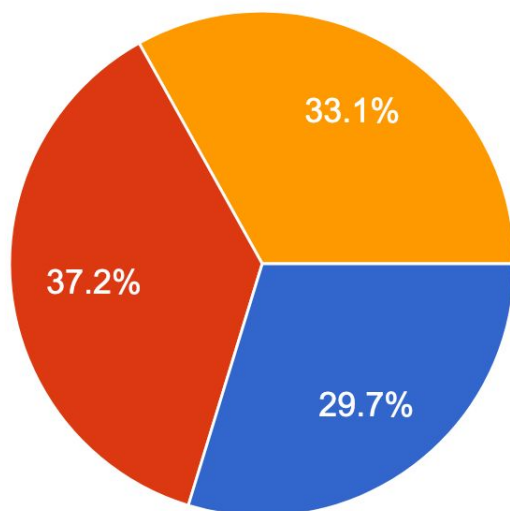
Overall Impressions

- * People who are unlikely to attend tended to say that they would likely wait until Covid spread is no longer a major concern within the area, and/or that they would wait until there is a vaccine available.
- * The main reasons people expressed they would be unlikely to attend included being concerned about their own health, making others sick, and feeling a responsibility to stay at home to stop the spread.
- * It is clear that the virtual streaming liturgies have been very meaningful to the community, as a whole. Roughly 80% of all respondents stated that it has been helpful or very helpful in their spiritual practice during the pandemic, and about 75% said that it has been helpful or very helpful in staying connected to the community. Around 11% have not attended.

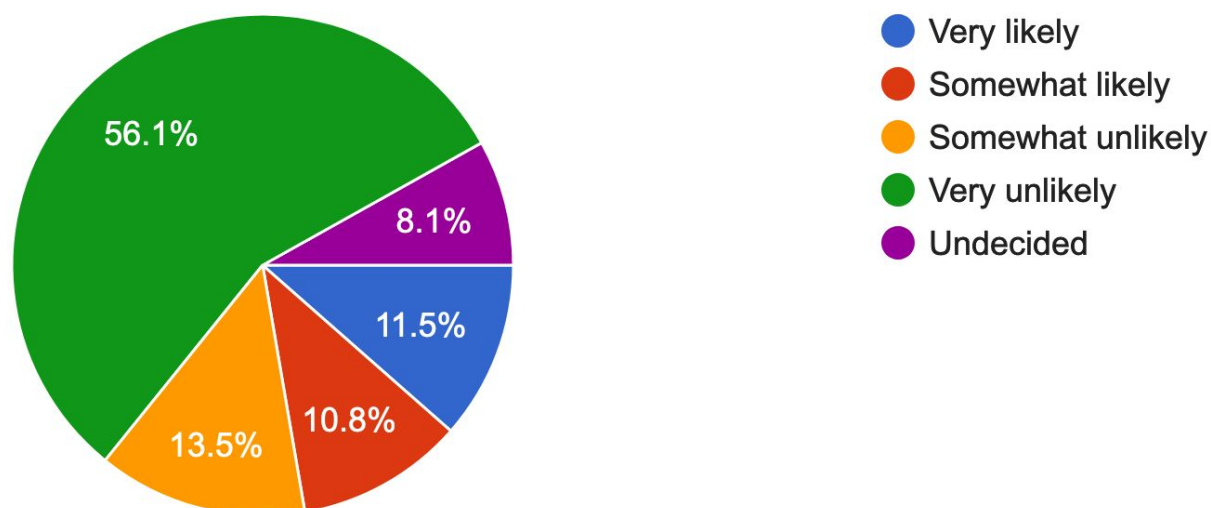


- I believe it would be best for the Paulist Center to resume in-person Masses in August, provided we can safely follow the procedures and protocols of the archdiocese and the local government.

The Paulist Center is tentatively planning to offer in-person Mass in early August. Based on your current thinking, how likely are you to attend?

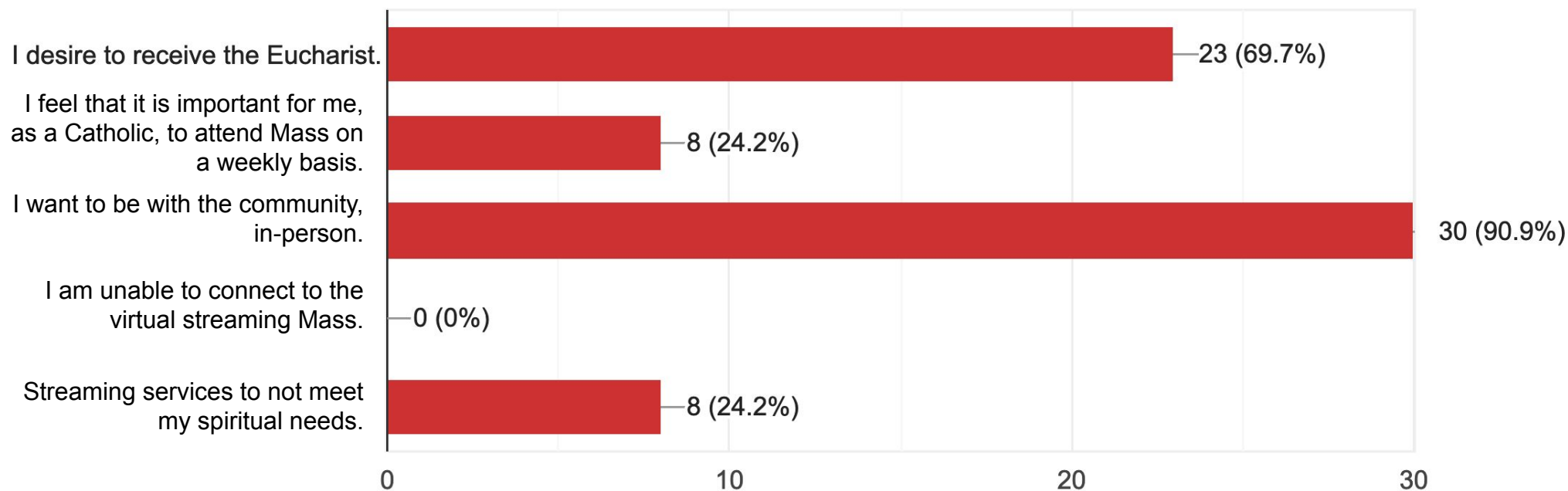

If you are planning to attend, which of these are reasons why you would do so? (Select any that apply)

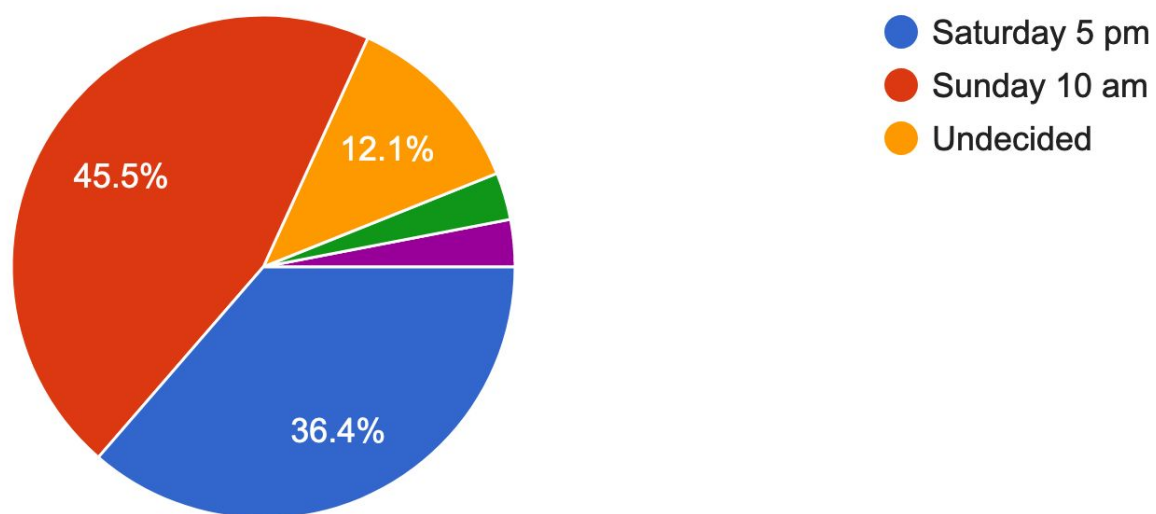

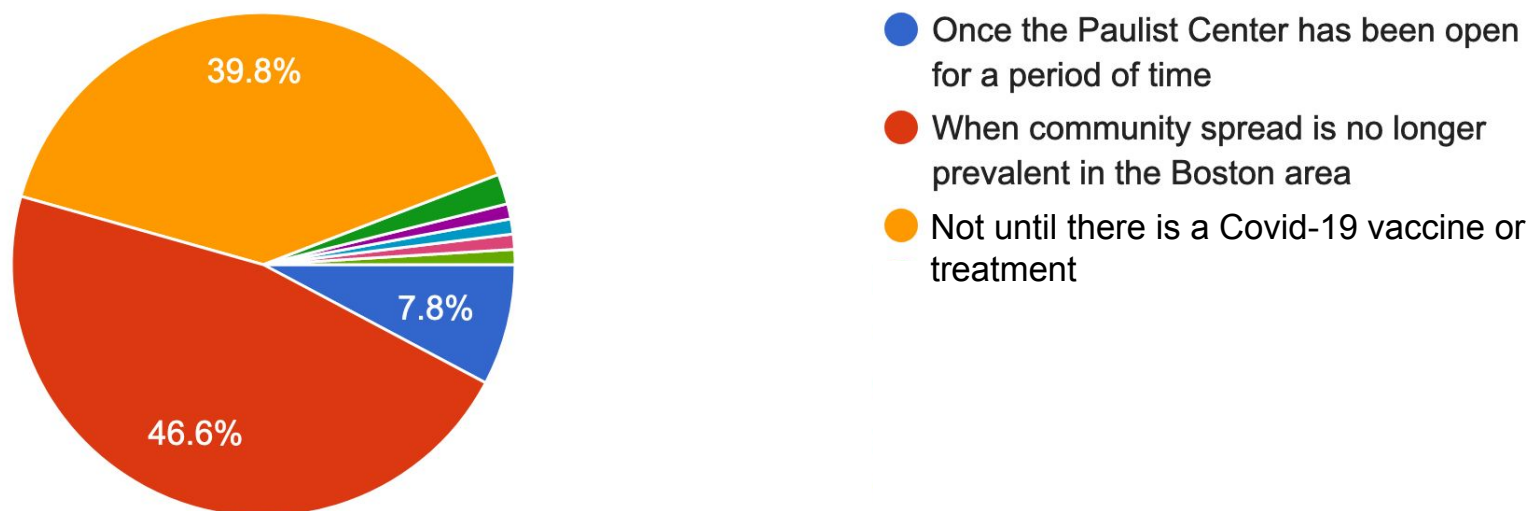

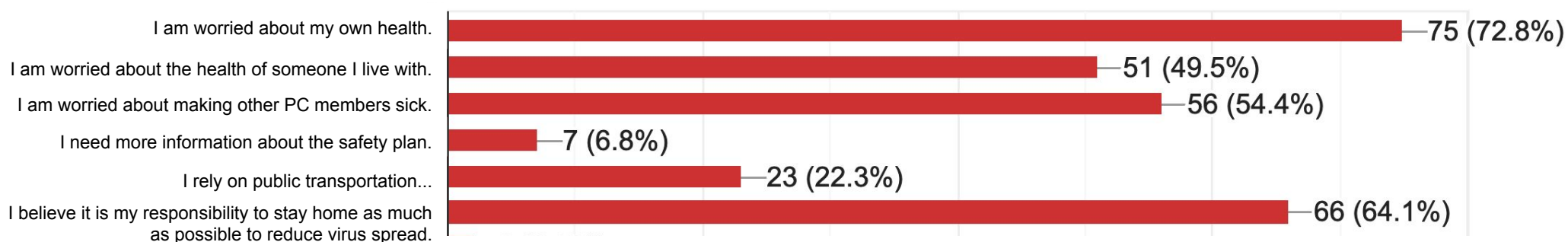

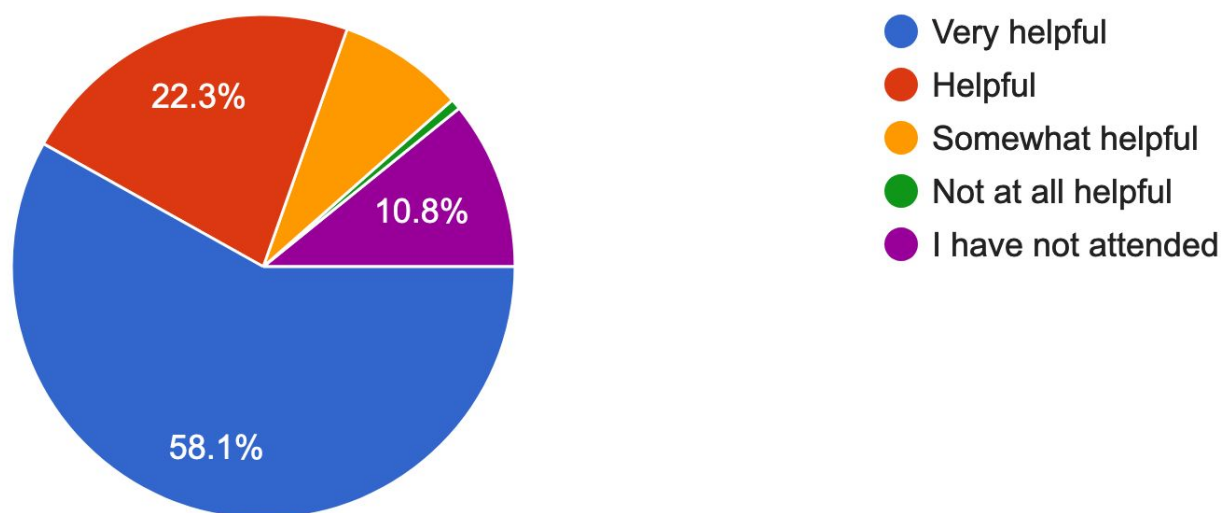

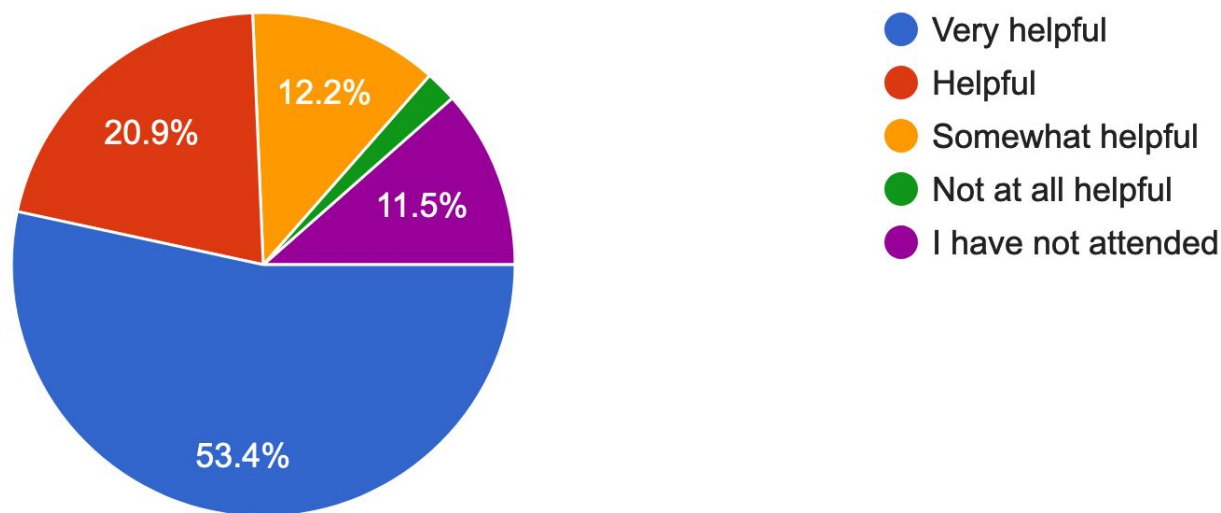

Synopsis of Comments

- * The community expressed deep gratitude to the staff and volunteers who have made streaming liturgies possible, as well as continuing the Food Pantry and Wednesday Night Supper Club.
- * Many were grateful for the community's discussions and response to the call of anti-racism.
- * A number of respondents mentioned that they have found the 10am Family Liturgy of the Word to be a prayerful, helpful experience.
- * Many expressed concern about gathering in large groups during this time, and felt that it would be safer to wait until a Covid-19 vaccine or cure is available.

Synopsis of Comments

- * Several people who are living in far-flung geographic locations shared that they have enjoyed being able to participate with the PC community virtually.
- * Some respondents were seeking more online programming opportunities.
- * Many conveyed that they greatly miss gathering as a community, and look forward to the time when we can safely join together again in-person.
