

We anticipate opening the Paulist Center Chapel on July 18-19, 2020. Masses will be held Saturday, 5pm; Sunday, 10am and 6pm. The Saturday 5pm Mass will be recorded and then broadcast at 12 noon on Sunday.

#### RESERVING A PLACE FOR MASS ATTENDANCE

From Wednesday – 10am through Friday noontime people may register on Eventbrite to indicate which Mass they will be attending. Please print out or have your registration available on a mobile device when you come to the Chapel.

One may also call the main office (617-742-4460) between 10am and 5 pm Wednesday, Thursday, and 10am – 12 noon on Friday.

Registration will assist us in being ready for you. Seats are limited. Please arrive on time.

#### APPROACHING THE CHAPEL

As people approach the chapel doors, there will be blue tape on the sidewalk in both directions indicating the recommended 6 feet distancing.

Doors will open 10 minutes prior to the service. Only the Red Chapel Doors will be open. (The office door will remain closed and locked.) People in wheelchairs and walkers may need additional assistance.

Masks are required unless a medical condition prohibits it. The CDC does not recommend masks for children under 2. We will take the temperature of everyone entering the Chapel. Hand sanitizer will be available in the vestibule.

Hospitality ministers will escort people to their seats.

Seating will be from the front to the back. The center aisles will be filled first, followed by the sides, then the balcony. People must follow the directions of the hospitality ministers. Families and/or households may sit together. Please note that the balcony will be open only when the floor is at capacity.

Entrance will be up the side aisles. Exit is down the middle aisle.

Balcony entrance is on the Tremont Street side. Balcony exit is on the Beacon Street side.

Restroom accessibility will be through the elevator lobby.

The sacristy is closed.

#### DURING MASS

The wearing of a mask is always required while in the Chapel.

Music will be limited during the celebration. The congregation is asked not to sing but may hum along.

There will be no physical contact during the Sign of Peace nor holding of hands during the Lord's Prayer.

Collection baskets will be placed in the vestibule as people leave the chapel.

#### COMMUNION PROCEDURES – PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF THE CHANGES

Hospitality ministers will direct the communion procession. Please do not leave your pew until indicated by the minister.

The communion procession will file up the side aisles and return by the center aisle.

Once you receive the consecrated bread step to the X indicated on the floor, remove your mask, consume the host, replace your mask, then return to your seat by the center aisle or the Mary alcove if seated on that side.

When necessary there will be communion stations in the balcony. Please follow the directions of the hospitality ministers.

All eucharistic ministers will have sanitized their hands and will wear a mask.

#### EXITING THE CHAPEL

Please do not leave your pew until indicated by the hospitality minister.

All will exit by the center aisle.

Balcony egress will be on the Beacon Street side stairwell.

All must leave the Chapel when asked to.

In respect for others and social distancing requirements please do not congregate in front of the Chapel upon leaving.

#### PARKING STAMP AND TICKETS

Parking stamp and tickets will be available in the vestibule on the Tremont Street side stairwell after Mass.
