## HEALING WOUNDS OF RACISM, BUILDING BELOVED COMMUNITY

Performed and facilitated by **Playback For Change**

In 4 interactive sessions of theater and discussion, participants see themselves in one another's stories of race and racism as they are brought to life on stage

### **Sep 20** *Embracing Diversity* **Trinity, Swarthmore 2-4:30 pm**

An introductory experience of Playback Theatre that affirms the power of diversity and our common humanity and gives a taste of the rest of the sessions. Open to all.

### **Oct 11** *Telling the Whole Story* **African Episcopal Church of St. Thomas, Philadelphia 2-4:30 pm**

A session for People of Color to face racism and affirm resilience through healing and community building. Open to those who are Black, Indigenous or identify as Non-Black People of Color.

### **Nov 15** *Exploring Our Whiteness* **Incarnation Holy Sacrament, Drexel Hill 3-5:30 pm**

A session to explore the experience of ingesting, upholding and resisting beliefs and behaviors that shape White supremacy. Open to those who identify as White.

### **Jan 17** *Creating Common Cause* **St. Alban's, Newtown Square 2-4:30 pm**

A session for everyone to share their stories and experiences of resisting and healing from racism, and how to continue the work together. Open to all.

### **What is Playback Theatre?**

Audience members' real stories become the source material. The performance is spontaneous - it is theater created through a unique collaboration between performers and audience.

Someone from the audience tells a story or moment from their life, chooses actors to play the different roles, then watches as their story is immediately recreated on "stage."
