

### Planning Services Program

- Planning services for both these
   Park Plans were awarded to the
   Cities of Lakewood and
   Warrensville Heights through the
   2022 Cuyahoga County Planning
   Commission Community
   Planning Grant
- 15 total applicants
  - 4 awardee communities
- Plans were completed in Spring 2023

#### Lakewood:

- Respond to the evolving needs and values of the community
- Guide future investments in the Park
- Address aging infrastructure
- Include multigenerational and multicultural needs
- Increase access
- Include community wellness
- Align with the findings from previous studies


#### Warrensville Heights:

- Bridge the gap for more green space and park and recreational areas as three elementary schools and their playgrounds close
- Develop and build an intergenerational green space at the site of the former John Dewey Elementary school
- Develop walking trails for all ages and abilities
- Promote physical activity
- Encourage community engagement



### Demographics & Current Conditions

#### Lakewood & Madison Park:

- High density of individuals and households
- Higher % of children and very young children
- Higher % of racial and cultural minorities and limited English-speaking households
- Lower amount of greenspace and tree canopy and higher amounts of impervious surfaces
- Highly walkable community with many surrounding businesses and amenities



### Demographics & Current Conditions

#### Warrensville Heights & Green Road Park:

- Approx. 5,300 reside within ½-mile walk of project site
- Adolescent, teen, and seniors 3X higher in the
   ½-mile walk of the project site than in the city
- Approx. 47% of total households are adjacent to project site
- Highly walkable community with a demand for bike travel to local and regional trail networks
- Over 153 acres of parks, green, and open spaces
  - Total of 26 total acres for Green Road Park & former John Dewey School site

### Many Roles of a Community Park

- Physical & Mental Health
  - Place for exercise, play, and stress reduction
- Community and Social Health
  - Place for gathering and hosting community events
- Community Building
  - Place where new residents learn about community, make connections, receive services
- Community Support Services
  - Place for childcare (camps), food distribution (farmers markets, free and reduced lunches), and information distribution
- Environmental & Educational Hub
  - Place for stormwater management, pollination, and fresh air and diverse, interactive, and hands-on learning



### Impact of Parks on Youth Health

- Children who live within two-thirds of a mile from a park with a playground are five times more likely to be a healthy weight
- A 20-minute walk in a park or other natural area can help children with ADHD focus better
- Youth living in neighborhoods with multiple recreation and park facilities are more likely to be active five times a week, compared to young people who have access to none

### Impact of Parks on Senior Health

- The amount of green space in a neighborhood is positively associated with health status of older people.
- Seniors who lacked parks have higher incidence of hypertension, depression, and chronic diseases
- Seniors living closer to parks experience less cognitive decline
- People aged 50 and over who lived within walking distance of a park had better perceptions of their physical and mental health

#### Barriers to Park Attendance for Youth & Seniors

- Access to and from parks
- Accessibility within park
- Appropriate equipment and activities
- Appropriate amenities
- Real and perceived feelings of safety



### Our Experience

Typically, in Master Planning Process:

- Experience lower engagement and response rates from kids and younger adults
- Experience higher engagement and response rates from older adults
- Considering the impact of community parks in and near youth and senior populations, we wanted to ensure their engagement



### Traditional Engagement - Challenges

- Survey Response: 1,129 (!!)
  - 3.9% response rate from Under 18
- Community Events
  - 1-2 kids offered opinions, but most often were interested in other activities
- Stakeholders
  - Adults, some worked with youth, but insights were second-hand
- Public Meetings
  - Very few under the age of 25





### Targeted Youth Outreach - Board Activity


- Survey sent directly to students
- Engaged more than 200 students at Harrison Elementary and Padre Pio Academy
- 4 teams of 2 staff visited each classroom
- Students were given 6 dots and asked to place them on 3 boards (2 dots per board) to indicate:
  - What do they like most
  - What do they like least
  - What do they want most




### "Dream Park" exercise - splash pad





### Insights that Influenced Recommendations

- Include less traditional features in playground rebuild: ziplines, obstacle courses, tunnels
- Include a splash pad and water features in pool rebuild
- Very aware of areas considered off-limits or obstacles to play, i.e. teen or adult areas and community garden: distance these area from playground
- Graffiti and vulgar language greatly impacted young children: use special surfaces
- Children crave nature experiences from nature paths to nature themed playgrounds: introduce more trees and naturalized landscaping where possible







# Traditional Engagement - Challenges

- Survey Response: 155
  - 125 online, 30 paper
  - 297 written comments
  - 69% response rate from Age 50+
- Student Worksheet
  - Grades K-8
  - 41 worksheets completed
- Community Engagement
  - 3 Public Meetings
    - Low attendance from youth and families
  - Community Festival
    - More young adults and families

Respondents were asked "What is your age?" Responses: 129





#### Results & Outcomes

- Community members expressed their desires to update and enhance Green Road Park
- Develop the proposed park 'Friendly City Park' to become a multigenerational and inclusive, community gathering place for families, children, and seniors
- Repurpose the existing baseball fields into a multipurpose field
- Parks should feature new and improved amenities such as amphitheater, walking trails, key water feature, and playgrounds
- Parks should complement the varied ages and activity levels for all community members

# Youth Engagement Tips:

- Go where they already are (schools, games, events)
- Involve school administration on steering committee!
- Make it fun, short, and visual
- Use platforms they use (with parent approval, if needed)
- Leave space for open-ended questions and discussion



# Senior Engagement Tips:

- Offer print & digital
- Leverage familiar spaces and routines
- Slow it down create space for conversations
  - Builds trust

- Go where they are

- Couple surveys with creative activities
- Build flexibility into youth engagement plan
