Best Practices for Completing a "Skeletal" Asylum Application

Filing a "skeletal" asylum application is an important first step in both affirmative and defensive asylum cases. She will share best practices for completing the biographical sections and substantive questions on the form, as well as tips for filing with both USCIS in affirmative cases and EOIR in defensive cases.

Representing Clients at Bond Hearings in Immigration Court

PAIR's Irene Freidel will be giving a training on how to represent detained "recent arrival" clients at bond hearings in Immigration Court. A number of asylum seekers continue to be detained at the Wyatt Detention Center, on the MA/RI border. PAIR frequently has a number of pro bono bond cases. The timeframe on a bond case is about 2 weeks after case placement/acceptance, and pro bono attorneys can make an enormous impact on releasing those in detention.
