




AGC Chapters Coronavirus Survey Results

1. Please let us know if you are hearing about any of the following impacts on construction from local, state or federal government actions (or inactions). Responses: 81. (Check all that apply)





1	It appears there is a huge increase of e-mails coming from AGC of America. It might help all of us receiving them if you guys maybe combined messages. On top of what we receive from you, we are then getting the "forum groups" who are loading up e-mails. We need to keep everyone calm; not panic...so we all need to get better at pushing out the information. I've told my staff one message a day; we are holding all tidbits of necessary information until mid-day at which time we will combine into a Chapter message. It's a crazy time; but we need to keep them calm!!
2	AGC is doing an excellent job
3	Job sites and customers are not allowing visitors/sales calls.
4	AGC FEC and its members appreciate all you are doing and we continue to push the information out - keep it coming - especially information that could be used for elected officials locally and construction departments. I've been working to compile my own data for them such as number of employees of my members and residents in the counties. I'm actively engaged with our elected bodies and local construction departments in my chapter area and there is no discussion with commissioners currently as of this morning to halt construction. In fact, one pushed approval item on agenda yesterday, which would lead to construction jobs.

	I also gave Brian encouraging information from FTBA/FDOT yesterday. Of course, we all recognize things could change and quickly with various decision-making.

9	Just keep the projects moving forward! Health and safety are important, but the health of our companies and jobs is too!
10	Provide guidelines on teleworking, sample teleworking policy, and best practices
11	Keep safety paramount; but be realistic. Seems like everyone is panicking too much.
12	I believe we need to continue to share best practices that each chapter are utilizing.
13	We suggest frequent conf call/webinars to update membership on changing safety, hr, legislative and business operations.
14	Construction site best practices focus (most content in general circulation is for office environment) 1. Construction site cleaning and sanitation best practices (i.e., porta potties, etc.) and PPE. 2. What to do if a crew member test positive or is suspected to be positive 3. Keep being a national resource ... Thank you, thank you
15	Doing a great job on the OSHA front and with bill before the Senate. Protecting small businesses is the key. Provide best practices for contractors who may have an owner or state/federal that forces a project shut down. Particularly how to handle laid off employees, have them sign up for employment, etc. These are the questions I'm receiving from members.
16	Trying to remain engaged with members and show them value in AGC. Thx
17	Offer webinars to members providing updates as you know of them.
18	General sharing of information regarding actions being taken across the nation impacting projects and job sites. Also, information concerning supply chain disruption, contract administration, and other BMPs
19	I believe two things could help members; 1) Webinar on contract language related to unforeseen events. 2) Perhaps deferring loan/lease payments for 3-6 months would encourage folks to stay home to curtail the spread by providing that temporary relief. It is much more efficient than cutting checks as suggested by some in Congress. It shouldn't eliminate those obligations, but simply defer payments for a certain time (mortgages/equipment loans etc) Thanks for everything, AGC America is the best. Stay healthy.
