If you are an older adult or have limited income and are looking for help with taxes, stop by the City's Civic Center Branch Library at 365 F Street on Thursday or Friday from 10 am to 2 pm. The **AARP Foundation's Tax-Aide** program will be providing free tax assistance through April 12 on a walk-in basis only. For other tax assistance options, please call 2-1-1. The **Otay Ranch Branch Library will be moving to a new suite** at the Otay Ranch Town Center. Located in Suite 1103 near Macy's and next to The Barking Spot, the library will have approximately 4,000 square feet of space for books, passport services, programs and more. The City will host an annual **National Prescription Drug Take Back Day** on Sat. April 27 from 10 am – 2 pm. Anyone who has expired, unused, or unwanted prescription drugs is encouraged to drop them off for disposal at the City's John Lippitt Public Works Center located at 1800 Maxwell Rd.
