Right now we are 100% focused on quickly adapting our programs and providing support to ensure the safety, stability, emotional well-being and agency of our 600 girls.

- While we are a school-based program, we are ensuring continuity in support through virtual versions for all 43 groups using available technology.**
- We are reaching out to each of the 600 girls we serve, systematically checking in to ensure their safety, sharing resource information and listening to their concerns.**
- We are responding to immediate needs and concerns. Essential resources – such as food, formula, diapers and personal hygiene products - and we were able, thanks to a \$5,000 donation from the V&S Foundation and matching funds, to create an [Emergency Covid-19 Fund](#). Since March 13th, we have served 51 families, including 231 adults, children and babies.**


Celebrates her first year in office


Crittenton attends the Hispanic Heritage Foundation's Youth Awards honoring exceptional Latino high school seniors who excel in the classroom and community!
