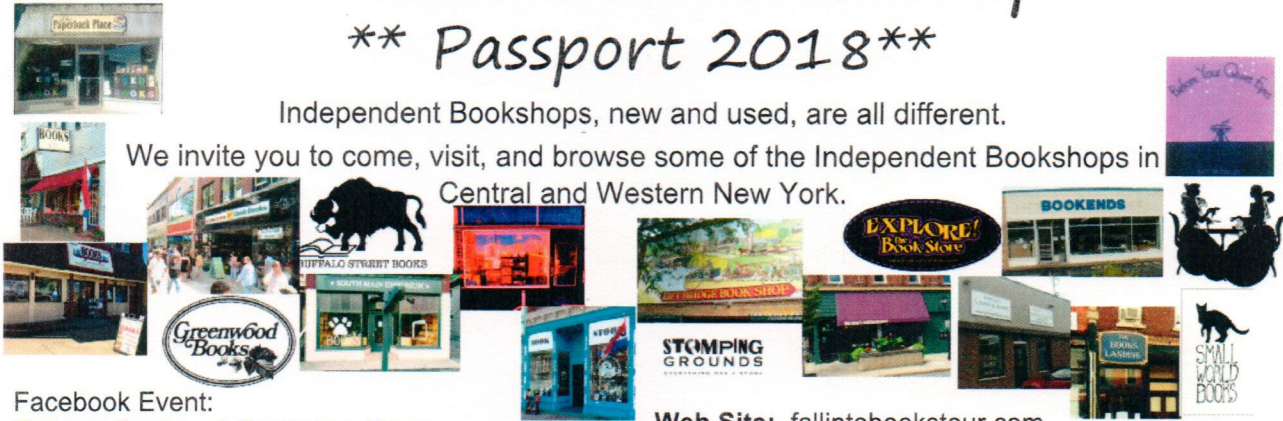

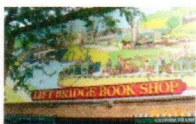

4. Bring this Passport with you as you visit the participating Bookshops listed inside.
5. Present this Passport at each Bookshop to have it stickered/stamped to be eligible to win a Gift Basket!**
6. With this Passport, you will receive 10% OFF any purchase you make at each participating Bookshop.
7. Please leave your completed Passport at the last store you visit.
8. Passports must be turned in to a participating Bookshop by close of business October 31, 2018.
9. ONE Passport per customer. You must be 16 YEARS OLD to enter.
10. YOU must be present and enter each store to get a stamp/sticker. NO exceptions.
11. Gift Basket Drawing to award 2 Gift Baskets will be held in November.

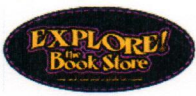

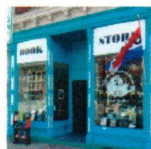

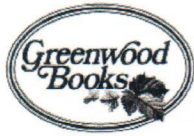
