

Springfield-Hampden County Continuum of Care FY26 Competition

Instructions for Renewal of Priority Tier 1 Projects

The Springfield-Hampden County Continuum of Care FY26 Competition Policies and Procedures, dated June 22, 2026, indicates that certain existing projects have been prioritized for renewal and will be placed in Tier 1. The CoC has determined that it will place the following projects in Tier 1: HMIS, Coordinated Entry projects, PSH projects, and projects in their first year of operation. The following projects are included:

While these projects will be placed in Tier 1, the CoC has not yet determined whether the projects will be renewed at their existing grant amounts. Some projects consistently underspend their grants. In these cases, the CoC Project Selection and Ranking Committee will determine whether the total grant renewal amount should be reduced.

In order for the CoC to have sufficient information to make determinations of funding levels, providers of renewal grants must complete and submit the CoC Renewal Grant Information Form no later than Monday, July 27 at 5 pm.

Providers will be notified no later than August 11, 2026 of project renewal funding amounts. Providers will be required to coordinate with the CoC to prepare/update *esnaps* project applications during the period August 11 through August 19. HUD has still not opened FY26 *esnaps* applications. The CoC will notify CoC providers once the applications are available.
