CONFESSION OF SIN

(Kneel as able.)

Leader: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

All: Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in

thought, word and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have

left undone.

We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of

your Name. Amen.

Leader: Almighty God, have mercy on us, forgive us all our sins through our Lord

Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy

Spirit keep us in eternal life. *Amen*.

Who gives justice to those who are oppressed,* and food to those who hunger.

The Lord loves the righteous; the Lord cares for the stranger;* he sustains the orphan and widow, but frustrates the way of the wicked.

The LORD shall reign for ever,* your God, O Zion, for all generations. Hallelujah!

THE FIRST LESSON

(Please be seated.)

Lector: A reading from Acts 19:11-20

God did extraordinary miracles through Paul, so that when the handkerchiefs or aprons that had touched his skin were brought to the sick, their diseases left them, and the evil spirits came out of them. Then some itinerant Jewish exorcists tried to use the name of the Lord Jesus over those who had evil spirits, saying, I adjure you by the Jesus whom Paul proclaims.' Seven sons of a Jewish high priest named Sceva were doing this. But the evil spirit said to them in reply, Jesus I know, and Paul I know; but who are you?' Then the man with the evil spirit leapt on them, mastered them all, and so overpowered them that they fled out of the house naked and wounded. When this became known to all residents of Ephesus, both Jews and Greeks, everyone was awestruck; and the name of the Lord Jesus was praised. Also many of those who became believers confessed and disclosed their practices. A number of those who practised magic collected their books and burned them publicly; when the value of these books[a] was calculated, it was found to come to fifty thousand silver coins. So the word of the Lord grew mightily and prevailed.

Lector: Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.

All: Thanks be to God.

THE SECOND SONG OF ISAIAH

(All together.)

Seek the Lord while he wills to be found;* call upon him when he draws near. Let the wickes forsake their ways* and the evil ones their thoughts; And let them turn to the Lord, and he will have compassion,* and to our God, for he will richly pardon. For my thoughts are not your thoughts,* nor your ways my ways says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth,* so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts. For as rain and snow fall from the heavens* and return not again, but water the earth, Bringing forth life and giving growth,* seed for sowing and bread for eating, So is my word that goes forth from my mouth;* it will not return to me empty; But it will accomplish that which I have purposed,* and prosper in that for which I sent it.

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the good news of God and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."

As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea, for they were fishers. And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of people." And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and followed him.
