Minutes of Business Meeting April 6, 2017

Call to Order By: Grand Knight Walter Dworak

The meeting began with an opening prayer, the Pledge of Allegiance and the opening ode.

Grand Knights Report: The GK asked Frank Pacifico, Tom Ross and Father Philip Johnson to come forward. Frank made a presentation of an altar to Father for use at his residence. The altar was built by Frank and Tom with an attached plaque donated by John James at Heavenly Pines. Father thanked Frank, Tom and the Council for his gift.

Wayne Woods mentioned the recent vocation session attended by 100 people. At a prior board meeting Wayne discussed the council donating less than \$500 to pay transportation costs.

Financial Secretary's Report: A 3rd Degree Installation will take place in Raleigh on April 8th with four knights from our council being initiated: Remi Lamoureux, Mark Moore, Brian Canfield and Raymond Druss. Membership cards for 2017 are ready for mailing upon receipt of dues. Our State Convention delegates are Walter Dworak and John Pantaleo, the alternates are Tom Ross and Frank Pacifico.

Service Programs: The final 300 Club Drawing is scheduled for May 12th at 6pm in Founders Hall. Jack MacMillan reported that letters and email will go out on April 7th and that all committee chairmen are in place.

Adopt a Child – Carl Knauer reported that all teachers and Brothers in Charge have been notified for this May 9th event which includes the older students only. The party in December will be a Christmas event with Santa Clause for the lower classes of younger students.

St. Patrick's Day dinner – the council made a profit of about \$1500. Tom Ross said that next year he may consider door prizes.

Scholarships – Applications are due by April 22nd. Tomorrow an Eblast will be sent out.

Home School – John Pantaleo reported that to date students have not heard anything and that there has been no bulletin announcement because the concern is free-lance people coming in.
