## Full-Day Hybrid Model

### GENERAL OVERVIEW:

The full-day hybrid learning model will look similar to the current hybrid model, only it will extend the school day until 2:15 p.m. and include lunch, recess, and specialist time daily.

Specifically, it will include the following:

- Licensed St. Louis Park Public Schools teacher
- Curriculum aligned with state standards, Multilingual Learners (ML) and special education services
- All students will attend school in-person two days each week, in A and B cohorts
- Cohort A (last names A-K) will be at school Mondays and Tuesdays, and Cohort B (last names L-Z) will be at school Thursday and Fridays
- Each cohort will be approximately half of the total number of enrolled students in a class; on other days, students will be learning from home
- Opportunities for in-person social interaction with classmates
- Daily morning meeting and timely feedback with teachers
- Asynchronous access to learning opportunities to sustain and deepen learning via Seesaw, on distance learning days
- Teacher connections with students and families on Wednesdays

**COHORT A at School Monday & Tuesday** / Cohort B participating in at-home distance learning with Seesaw.

**COHORT A/B at Home Wednesday** / All students participate in at-home distance learning with Seesaw.

**COHORT B at School Thursday & Friday** / Cohort A participating in at-home distance learning with Seesaw.

### Sample In-Person Daily Schedule

#### MORNING MEETING

Building community by connecting with teachers and peers to get ready for a day of learning.

#### LITERACY

Reading, writing and word study through transdisciplinary lessons.

#### MATH

Math is taught every day in all learning models by the classroom teacher.

#### SPANISH & ENGLISH

At Aquila, Peter Hobart, and Susan Lindgren Elementary Schools, English is taught by the classroom teacher and introductory Spanish is taught by a Specialist as part of the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (IB-PYP). All classroom instruction is in Spanish at Park Spanish Immersion Elementary School and English teachers help students master both languages.

#### LUNCH & RECESS

Students have the opportunity to safely interact with peers and school staff.

#### SPECIALISTS

Specialist content [i.e. Spanish (AQ/PH/SL), English (PSI), Physical Education, & Music] will be taught in an asynchronous manner, at a minimum. The District is exploring options to provide these subjects in-person.

### Sample At-Home with Seesaw Daily Schedule

#### MORNING MEETING

Building community by connecting with teachers and peers to get ready for a day of learning.

#### READING, WRITING & WORD STUDY

Students will engage in reading, writing and thinking about text; and continue to learn and practice word study skills.

#### MATH

Continue to learn and practice math concepts.

#### TRANSDISCIPLINARY LESSONS

Through transdisciplinary lessons (inclusive of social studies and science), students will sustain and deepen learning in literacy.

Each of the four elementary schools will offer a Distance Learning Academy that features, at a minimum, the following:

- Full-day Distance Learning Academy Model
- Licensed St. Louis Park Public Schools teacher
- Curriculum to align with state standards, Multilingual Learners (ML), and special education services
- Daily morning meeting and timely feedback from teachers
- Synchronous instruction in content areas
- Asynchronous access to learning opportunities to sustain and deepen learning via Seesaw
- Asynchronous specialist content
- Teacher connections with students and families on Wednesdays
- Opportunities for online social interaction with classmates
- Remainder of the 2020-21 school year commitment
