

# **Energy Assistance Program**

## **Minnesota Energy Assistance Program**

The Minnesota Energy Assistance Program (EAP) administers Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) funds appropriated through the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services. The Department of Commerce administers EAP in Minnesota.

#### **EAP Services**

EAP helps eligible households meet energy needs by:

- Providing grants to pay energy bills
- Addressing no-heat crisis situations through payments and furnace repair or replacement
- Providing referrals and advocacy

### Applying for EAP

Households seeking EAP assistance should contact their local EAP service provider. #### **EAP Service Delivery**

29 local service providers determine eligibility, approve payments, and provide advocacy, outreach and referral services. They are Community Action Programs, counties, tribal governments and non-profits serving all areas of the state.

#### **EAP Serves**

- Renters and Homeowners
- Renters paying for heat directly to an energy vendor or indirectly (in rent to a landlord)

## Other information

- Eligibility is based on the past three months of income
- Assets such as the home are not considered in determining eligibility
- Grants from \$200 to \$1,400 depending on household size, household income and fuel consumption
- The average grant is about \$545
