Site and project timeline

- **1962:** City begins assembling the first of the 161 properties that will make up the site to be presented to the federal government.
- Aug. 10, 1962: Demolition of the buildings begin.
- June 7, 1965: Official ground-breaking.
- May 15, 1967: IRS data processing center opens. At its peak, the facility will employ 4,000 full-time and seasonal workers.
- Sept. 14, 2016: IRS gives three-year notice of facility's closing.
- **Nov. 8, 2018:** City hires architecture and design firm Cooper Carry to crystalize vision for its redevelopment.
- Late-September 2019: Facility closes.
- Dec. 17, 2019: Cooper Carry presents conceptual master plan to Covington Board of Commissioners.
- Aug. 3, 2020: City gains control of site, having bought it from the General Services Administration for roughly \$20.5 million.
- **September 2020:** New zoning district created for IRS site as part of the City's adoption of the transformational citywide Neighborhood Development Code.
- December 2020: City receives preliminary approval from the Kentucky Economic
 Development Finance Authority to create a state-based "signature" TIF, or tax increment
 financing district, that includes the IRS site. This financing mechanism would use a
 portion of future state sales, income and property tax revenues to pay a significant part
 of the site preparation costs, including construction of horizontal infrastructure.
- October 2021: City hires project manager J.S. Held.
- February 2022: City hires demolition contractor O'Rourke Wrecking.
- March-April 2022: Removal of asbestos and other hazardous material from building.
- April 18, 2022: Ceremonial start to demolition.
- **Spring 2022:** City to hire design-engineering firm to oversee design of horizontal infrastructure, with design to be completed by first quarter 2023, and construction to start soon thereafter.
- Aug. 26, 2022: (projected) Completed demolition of building(s) and removal of asphalt, underground storage tanks, and concrete vault.
- August-September 2022: (projected) Grading, seeding etc. of cleared site.
- Sept. 30, 2022: (projected): Demolished, cleared site turned over to the City.
