

Fundamentals of Drawing Supply List - Madison College

- *Note:* I've linked to some examples for your reference, but the brand itself doesn't particularly matter. I've also linked to Blick, but you do not have to purchase from them. I personally recommend Lynn's of Madison for all your art supply needs!
- *Note:* You will need a sketchbook and drawing pencils each class!

- Sketchbook (any size is fine)
- Drawing pencils: HB, B, 2B, 4B, 6B - you may have more than this, but make sure you have at least these.
 - Pens are also welcome, just be sure to have pencils, too!
- Vine and/or Willow Charcoal (I recommend soft charcoal - the charcoal boxes will say on the box what their softness is. [Something like this is nice](#), it comes with a variety of stick sizes)
- White Drawing Paper Pad (18" x 24", slightly smaller is ok)
- 1 Kneaded Eraser ([like this](#))
- 1 White Eraser ([like this](#))
- Xacto knife (for sharpening pencils / shaping charcoal)
- Blending Stump ([like this](#))
- Sandpaper Block ([like this](#))
- Artist Chamois ([like this](#))
