

Watercolor Supply List

Where to buy supplies: Dick Blick and Jerry's Artarama are a few online options. Artist & Craftsman (203 W. Gorham st.)- this is a particularly good place to go if you want assistance finding and choosing supplies. As a last resort you can try Lynn's Art Supply on the west side on Odana Rd. Mention you are in my class and get a percentage off.

You may also want to save your receipts in case you want to return anything

Paper

140 lb. watercolor Paper (Cold press Arches is preferred)

1 Illustration Board (cold press) Crescent

9x12" Tracing Paper

Watercolor Brushes (synthetic ok)

1 Fan, No. 0-3

1 Flat, 1"

1 Round, No. 9

Student-grade watercolor paint in tubes...Windsor Newton is my personal preference

- Cobalt blue
- Burnt Sienna
- 1 Tube white gouache (small)

Drawing tools

#2 Pencil

Graphite Stick (compressed graphite Hardness No. 2, square)

Red ballpoint pen with cap

Pencil Sharpener

Kneaded Eraser

Miscellaneous

Portfolio (to carry your paper and artwork in)

Drawing Board - 11x14" or larger 20x30" is the largest you would use....Masonite or hard board works great (no need for clips).

Watercolor palette - any number of wells is ok. Porcelain or plastic works fine

Tackle box or something similar, to carry your supplies in

Small natural sponge

Masking Tape

Rubber cement pick-up

Palette Knife plastic or metal any type will do No. 814 is what I use

Bounty paper towels

X-acto Knife

3 Cotton Swabs

Margarine Bowl or other similar plastic for water

1 Sheet of paper (coarse)

Masking Fluid (small) ...Yellow
