






How to Change Your Mouse Pointer Color and/or Size in Windows 10



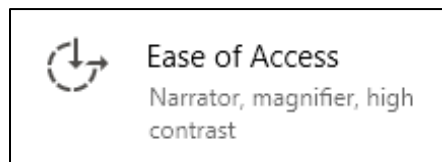
There can be a variety of reasons to change your mouse color or size. If you have trouble seeing the standard mouse pointer or if you are presenting and want your audience to clearly identify where you are pointing, you can customize the pointer display.

To change the **Pointer Color**:

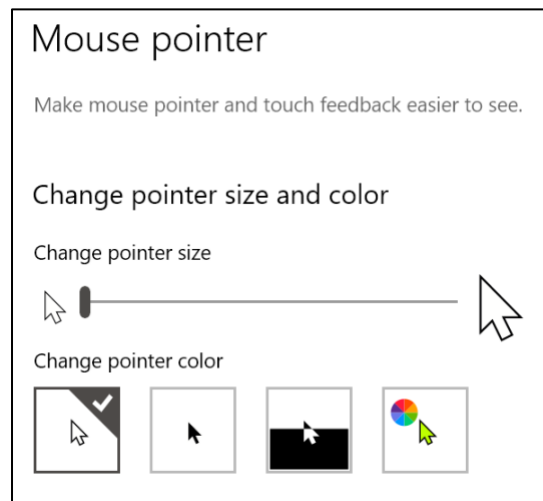
1. Launch the **Settings** page in Windows (use any of the methods shown here).

- a. From the Start button , select Settings .
- b. Or, *right-click* on the Start button  and select **Settings**.
- c. Or, press the **Windows key + I**.

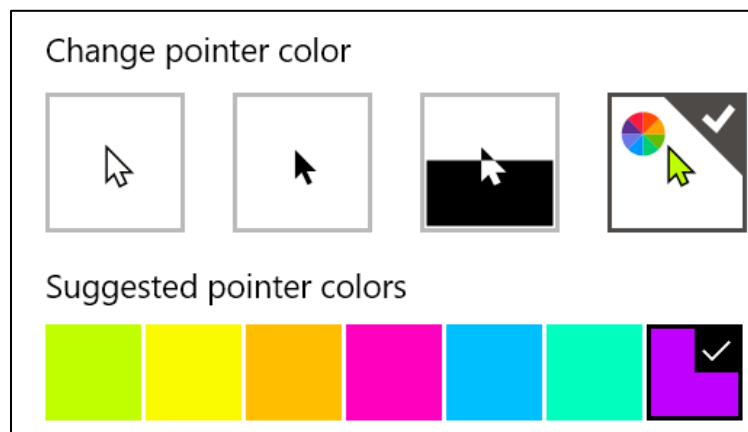
2. Choose **Ease of Access**.



3. Choose **Mouse Pointer** from the Ease of Access options on the left.

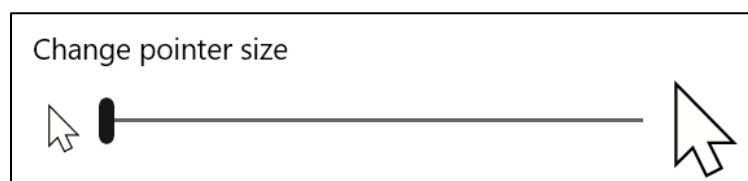


4. Click to select one of the options in the *Change pointer color* group. The selected option has a checkmark in the upper-right corner.
5. If you select the Custom Color option, you can choose one of the *Suggested pointer colors* or click on *Pick a custom pointer color* to create your own.

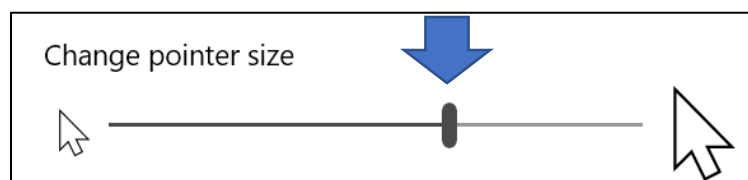


If you want to change the **Pointer Size**:

1. Repeat steps 1-3, above.



2. Drag the **Change pointer size** slider to increase or decrease the pointer.



3. All mouse pointers, including the I-beam cursor, are resized.
4. Experiment with the new size and color. If too large, it may be difficult to effectively select text or objects. Verify that the color is visible to those with vision impairments.
