Happy New Year! Here comes 2020 and we are ready for a year filled with memorable milestones and more successes!

First and foremost, we can add 2019 to the books as another successful year for Frontier House. We had an amazing year! Here are some highlights:

- ◊ At the 27th Employment and Education Banquet over 100 members were recognized for vocational achievements.
- ◊ A Legislative Meet and Greet was hosted by Clubhouse Colorado at the State Capitol Building. We met several legislators from around the state and discussed the importance of a Clubhouse in every community.
- ◊ The 8th Frontier House Breakfast Fundraiser was the biggest and most successful yet.
- ◊ Clubhouse Colorado Day at Mountain Park allowed the Colorado Clubhouses to celebrate our success and plan for next year.
- ◊ For the 3rd time in our history, we sent colleagues out of the country to attend the Clubhouse World Seminar. Five colleagues represented Frontier House at the Seminar in Norway.

◊ Demonstrating our commitment to Clubhouse International, we sent one colleague to the Clubhouse International Annual Faculty Meeting that was also held in Norway this year.

◊ Recognizing a need for a more versatile and useful database, we implemented a new Clubhouse Database called Flourish.

◊ It was a successful full year of occupancy in our Clubhouse Housing Program—Pioneer House.

◊ We held our first National Night Out event with local first responders.

◊ KUNC contacted us to run a story on our Clubhouse and the successes of our members. Thank you to Howard, George, Clark, JoJo, Charlotte, Jauniece and Alex for agreeing to visit with Stephanie Daniel, the KUNC reporter. They did an outstanding job in explaining the Clubhouse so that Stephanie could share about it in her web story and on-air.

2020 marks the 30th Anniversary of Frontier House. As we embark on this milestone, we are preparing for festivities to celebrate and commemorate 3 decades of success. There have been discussions about hosting an open house event to welcome our community into the Clubhouse and another celebration for our membership. The details are still in the works, but plan on sometime during the first half of the year. Please join us at the Clubhouse to help plan for these events.

In addition to the anniversary celebration, we are working with our Advisory Board in preparing for the 9th Frontier House Breakfast. We're looking for businesses and individuals who are interested in sponsoring the event, which will be held on May 6th at the DoubleTree by Hilton in Greeley.

This new year brings the need to send colleagues to Clubhouse Training as it has been a while since we've done so. We are currently looking at training bases and schedules to determine the best fit. We are hoping to send 2 staff and 1 member to the training.

Also this year, we are making preparations for a visit from Clubhouse International Faculty since our accreditation is due to lapse in April 2021. It will be important for us to schedule the visit at least 6 months ahead so that we have ample time to complete the Self-Study.

I'm looking forward to 2020 with my Clubhouse colleagues. May we all be blessed with another year full of friends, wellness and success!

Check in is at 9:30 am, the workshop is 10am to 4pm. Continental breakfast provided at check in, and a catered lunch is included. There is **no cost** for this program, but we do have limited space, so an RSVP is requested. Reservations can be made via phone (970) 988-5207, in person @ the Frontier House, or through a NAMI leadership Team member. **A WRAP can**; 1) decrease and prevent intrusive or troubling feelings and behaviors; 2) increase personal empowerment; 3) improve quality of life; and 4) achieve their own life goals and dreams. Working with a WRAP® can help individuals to monitor uncomfortable and distressing feelings and behaviors and, through planned responses, reduce, modify, or eliminate those feelings. A WRAP® also includes plans for responses from others when an individual cannot make decisions, take care of him/herself, and/or keep him/herself safe. A lot goes into this from certified presenters of the **Colorado Mental Wellness Network**, so lets make it a capacity event.



Sami only likes people he knows well. He loves to lay in your arms like a baby on his back and have his belly rubbed. He usually falls asleep this way. His tongue is always hanging out. The National Suicide Hotline Act

Yesterday, in its final Executive Session of 2019, the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation unanimously passed an MHA-favored bill, [**S. 2661, the National Suicide Hotline Designation Act**](#). Passing S. 2661 is a historic step closer to converting the National Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Crisis Lifeline to an easy to remember 3-digit number, [**988**](#), as recommended by the Federal Communications Commission in its [**August 2019 report to Congress**](#).

If you or someone you love were dealing with suicidal thoughts and wanted to reach out for immediate help, it can be hard to remember 1-800-273-8255, the current phone number for the Lifeline. Of the millions of screens taken by youth through MHA's [**online screening program**](#), nearly 50% of youth report having suicidal thoughts. All people in crisis, especially youth, have the right to access to services quickly. Converting to 988 will help them connect to support during times of distress in a timely manner.
