The Motivation

At the Fred Tjardes School of Innovation we continue to deepen our roots in the community by integrating off-campus learning into our usual routine. As frequently as is plausible, we get our students engaged with the world outside the boundaries of our building by visiting a variety of local institutions including businesses, government sites, museums, farms, factories, and more.

Currently, our outings are somewhat limited due to budgetary constraints. While we are given a budget each year for student transportation, the budget is rather small and regularly determines whether a proposed trip is cost prohibitive. As a result, we have become masters of the Greeley-Evans Transit (GET) system as they allow students to ride for free. But again, that limits our ventures to the reach of the GET routes.

Due to those typical restrictions, we have begun to think outside the box for solutions. Initially, the obvious answer was to raise funds to increase our transportation budget. Though the idea of needing to fundraise every year to fulfill this piece of our mission seemed unsustainable. Therefore, we have decided to gear our fundraising toward the purchase of an activity bus!

With the purchase of our own small activity bus, we could not only lift the restrictions of our transportation budget but also open up a new avenue of learning in our building: mechanics. Charged with the maintenance of the vehicle, our students (and frankly, our staff) would have the opportunity to learn some very useful life skills.

Our ultimate fundraising goal is \$60,000 (the quoted cost of the bus). Your contribution to our goal via sponsorship of the Miniature Golf Tournament would certainly help us realize that goal and would, of course, be very much appreciated.
