All laboratory courses are being offered remotely, using simulators and hands-on laboratory activities to ensure that students experiences mirror those they would have in a face-to-face lab.

Clinical Courses:

Internships will be conducted on-site in Leon County Schools, contingent upon changes due to COVID-19. Additionally, the College of Education will be utilizing Mursion Virtual Teaching software for the fall 2020 semester because it will afford undergraduate and graduate students the opportunity to participate in a mixed reality field clinical environment. Students will be able to interact with avatars representing small classes of students; thereby, providing them with simulated teaching experiences. The College of Education will also utilize other resources, such as the Teaching Channel, to provide students with varying opportunities to engage and observe. It is the goal of the College of Education to ensure uninterrupted access to teaching experiences for all students in the College of Education needing field clinical practice.

Both undergraduate (Health, Leisure/Fitness) and graduate (Counselling, Educational Leadership and Sport Management) internships will be offered remotely.

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Experiential Courses:

All of the experiential courses will be offered online. The College of Education will be adopting a new Mursion Virtual Teaching avatar-based software to aid in an online experiential approach.

In all departments courses are being offered remotely or online.
