- Today, C.O.P.E. is ran by Natasha Paddock, former Board President and long-time leader in local government.



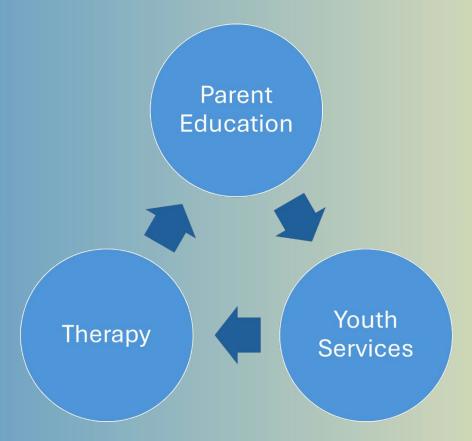
Our Mission

Youth Achievement Workshop

A workshop for teens that teaches emotional intelligence and self-regulation.

Youth Services

C.O.P.E. 4 Kids – Youth Mental Wellness

ARC

An evidence-based intervention designed to help youth heal from impacts of trauma.

Game of Life

An interactive, educational-based experience about life decisions and consequences.

Across Ages

A mentor program that pairs caring adults 55+ with youth to provide guidance, support, and positive role models.

Youth Mental Wellness Program: ARC Groups

Attachment, Regulation, and Competency (ARC) Model:

Evidence-based intervention to help youth heal from the impacts of trauma

Available to youth ages 10-17:

Group sessions of 8-12 students (middle school and high school groups)

Sessions & Topics:

- Anxiety (6 weeks 1 hour per week)
- Anger Management (8 weeks 1 hour per week)
- Social & Emotional Development (6 weeks 1 hour per week)

Cost: Free!

Participants will learn to develop coping skills, practice mindfulness techniques, and participate in activities to support anxiety reduction and regulation.

Group activities, field trips, and more!

Objectives:

- Uplifting Youth Perspectives and Insight
- Empowering Young Voices
- Building Leadership & Professional Skills
- Promoting Civic Engagement

Across Ages:

 Evidence-based mentorship program that pairs adults 55+ with youth to have positive mentors who provide guidance to foster intergenerational relationships

"HopSkipDrive"

Rideshare service that provides safe, reliable transportation services for youth

Youth Achievement Workshop & the Game of Life

6 week workshop for teens that teaches emotional intelligence and self-regulation.

Runs concurrently with a parent education class.

The Y.A.W. engages teens in the following areas:

- Goal setting & planning for the future.
- Career & life mapping.
- Alcohol and substance abuse, bullying and the effects of family trauma/violence.
- Self-Expression/Reflection Exercises

Teens will also participate in the "Game of Life" event:

 An interactive game that provides the opportunity to experience how the decision made today will affect future lifestyle consequences through simulation, practice, and other learning activities.



Pricing:

Until January 30th 2026, C.O.P.E. is able to provide these Youth Services offerings for free due to our CYBHI Round 4 grant funding!

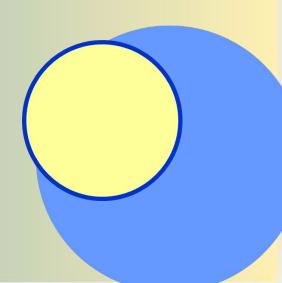
Program costs start at \$136 per hour and are tailored to meet the specific needs of your school community. Final pricing varies based on the selected program, the number of participating students, and the program's duration.

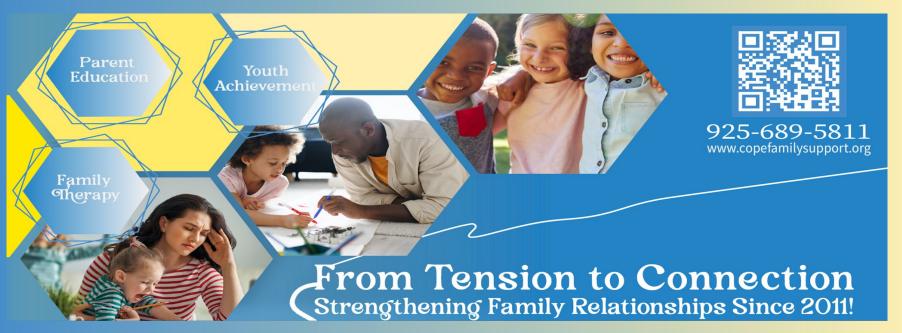
