### White House releases official proclamation for National Arts and Humanities Month in October

President Joe Biden signed on September 29, 2023, a proclamation declaring **October as Arts And Humanities Month** and called upon the people of the United States to observe the month with appropriate programs, ceremonies and celebrations.

According to the President, National Arts and Humanities Month provides an opportunity to “...**celebrate all of the artists and scholars who have dared to reveal the good, bad, and truth of our Nation**, and, in the process, have strengthened the covenant that is our democracy.”

The President added that his Administration is “...committed to ensuring that appreciation of and **access to the arts and humanities are within the reach of every American**.”

National Arts and Humanities Month (NAHM) was launched by Americans for the Arts more than 30 years ago, and is “...a collective recognition of the importance of culture in America.”
