This is the only time we ask our families for outright financial investments in Scouting. Registration dues paid to be a member of the BSA do not stay at the local Council. Yes, popcorn sales benefit both the Council and the Unit but those dollars are in return for a product. The Sagamore Council spends about \$150 per Scout, per year (approximately 5,000 Scouts) to provide the services needed to have Scouting in North Central Indiana by way of two magnificent camping facilities (Cary Camp and Camp Buffalo), two stores to purchase needed Scouting materials, uniforms, and more, Accident and Sickness Insurance for all of our registered members, liability insurance for our leaders and chartering organizations, professional support both in the communities that we serve and at our headquarters in Kokomo, training for our leaders, and many other services and benefits.
