**The Rev. Cody J. Sanders**, Ph.D., brand new to the Twin Cities, is an Associate Professor of Congregational & Community Care Leadership at Luther Seminary in Saint Paul. Prior to beginning this position in July, Cody served for eight years as pastor of Old Cambridge Baptist Church in Harvard Square, Cambridge, Mass., where he also served as an American Baptist Chaplain to Harvard University and Advisor for LGBTQ+ Affairs in the Office of Religious, Spiritual, and Ethical Life at MIT. He is the author and editor of several books, including *Corpse Care: Ethics for Tending the Dead* (Fortress, 2023) and *Christianity, LGBTQ Suicide, and the Souls of Queer Folk* (Lexington, 2020). Originally from South Carolina, Cody lives with his partner (also named Cody) and their dogs, Suzie, and Buddy, in Saint Anthony Park.

Part of Travis' sabbatical plan included a trip to upstate New York to visit exhibitions of the Hudson River School artists. He discovered that a number of the paintings are in MN - at MMAM - as part of the *Poetry in Nature* exhibit. From this discovery, Travis and the Sabbatical Team thought it would be meaningful to close the Sabbatical season with all of us coming together for a day in the reflective and renewing environment of the MMAM.

The *Poetry in Nature* exhibit has 40 paintings by 25 artists dating from 1818 to 1886. It is a varied survey of important paintings conceived in the style of the Hudson River School.

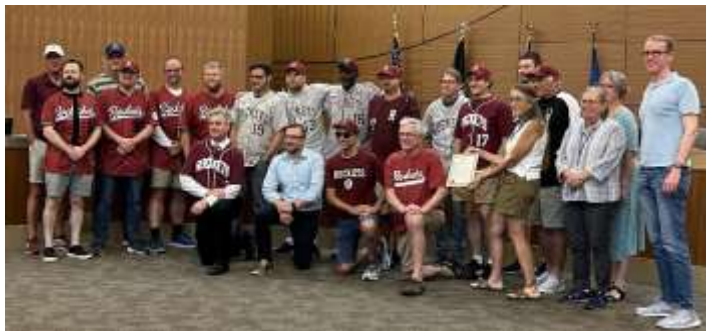

Land Acknowledgement Judson Church 2023

Place is more than just a piece of land. It is a piece of who we are. For too long, we have associated this place where Judson Church sits with our European/American roots, forgetting the people who called this place home for centuries before us. Mini Sota Makoce, Land where the Waters Reflect the Sky and specifically this part of the Twin Cities, is the ancestral home of the Dakhóta Wahpekute people. It is home to their creation stories; it is where they hunted, fished, harvested, and cared for the land, raised families, celebrated life in community, and buried their dead.

We acknowledge that it was at the hands of European Americans and the Federal government of the United States that this land was acquired by treaties and those treaties subsequently broken, resulting in the forced removal of the Wahpekute from their ancestral lands. We acknowledge that Dakhóta people were imprisoned in concentration camps, suffered starvation, disease, and forced assimilation because of the actions of the government “we the people” sanctioned. We remember and recognize the history of this land.

We recognize that Dakhóta, Anishinaabe, and other indigenous peoples live here today. They are our neighbors and fellow citizens. It is our obligation to do better by our neighbors, to stand with them and to learn from them as we seek to create a community that sees the creator’s face in everything.
