

Private Memorial Service for a Loved One

to be held virtually

Preparation

- Decide who will lead the service.
- Set up a meeting. You can use one of these apps or something else you know well:
 - Zoom (if the host has a business account so you do not have to worry about time limit.)
 - Microsoft Teams (free)
 - Go-to-Meeting (free)
 - Skype (free)
- Invite everyone you wish to attend and send them any log in information they will need.
- Invite each participants to have a picture of your loved one, an unlit candle and matches.
- The leader should also have a bell or chime to ring. (A wine glass or you-tube clip of a bell sounding also work!)
- Send a copy of this pdf to everyone you have invited.
- Choose a hymn and a final song from those listed and be ready to play them at the appropriate times.
- Ask for two people to be Reader 1 and Reader 2.

Invocation

Leader: Welcome to this time of remembrance of ________. Although we can't be present with one another in person, the love and grief we share binds us in honoring his/her memory. During our prayer, we will be invited to share a favorite memory or story that tells the unique way he/she has touched us. Storytelling has always been a sacred way of healing and connection to one another. It allows us to recognize the many, unrepeatable gifts each person has offered to our world. As we prepare to listen, let us welcome the presence of God and our loved one in a moment of silence.

Pause for silent prayer.

Sound the chime.

Leader: "I will call this to mind as a reason to hope. The favors of God are not exhausted. Each morning they are new, so great is God's mercy." (Lamentations 3)

All: In your mercy, be with us, O God.

Leader: "I am going to prepare a place for you, that where I am, you also may be." (John 14:3)

Storytelling

Leader: Now we come to the heart of our service. I invite anyone who wishes to tell a story or a memory that shares the special way ______ has touched you. Stories can help us to cry, to laugh, to be inspired and to know we are not alone in our loss. If someone would like to begin, please hold your hand near your face so I can see you. After you share, please light your candle.

(Anyone who wishes may share a story or memory about the person who has died. The leader sounds the chime after each story is completed and the story-teller lights their candle.)

Intercessions

Leader: Loving God, we thank you for the precious gift of ______. Welcome them into the light of your face and give them joy forever. Listen to our prayer now, for one another and for all our sisters and brothers.

Reader 2: Our response is, "Hear us, God of mercy."
