



Questions emerging from Watershed Discipleship

- What body of water has great meaning for your family, your history, or you? Why?
- What watershed are you willing to make real sacrifices for?
- How do we love the place we live in? Our watersheds?
- What are the stories of your watershed?
- How does your watershed reflect the scarcity and extraction of colonialism?
- How does your watershed reflect God's intention for abundance?
- As you stand at your kitchen sink, where does your water come from? What do we know upstream of our water?
- As you stand at your kitchen sink, where does your water go to? What happens to our water?
- How do we express gratitude to water?
- What is our water footprint?
- How does our individual and faith community engagement with water reflect God's wilderness values? Think of the Manna in the Wilderness with God as provider. (Manna of the Mar)
- How do we show up for our watershed as if our lives depend on it?
- What are the issues confronting your watershed?
- Would your church be willing to do their baptisms in the body of water nearest your church building? If not, why not?
- Who is already doing the work to tend, care, and be a good ally with your watershed? How can you join them? Or replicate what they are doing?
- What is your faith community's water footprint?
- How might you localize the liturgy for your congregation around bread, grapes, and other parts of your congregation's material life?

- What signage is present for your watershed? Can you provide some?
 - What activities or field trips do you have in and around your watershed that reflects your relationship?
 - What allies and resources are willing to do the joyful and confessional work of your relationship with your watershed and reciprocity with it?
 - What rights does your watershed have? How might you make those rights real?
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
