

Review of the PA Workforce Development Association Conference

In October 2020, the 36th annual Pennsylvania Workforce Development Association (PWDA) Conference was held virtually. This year's theme was *Driving Workforce Connections*. Rocky Bleier, Vietnam veteran and 4-time Super Bowl champion was the opening keynote speaker. He discussed the resiliency of humans and living in a culture of opportunity. He encouraged people to constantly learn, have the courage to act on information, and choose new opportunities to pursue. In adult education, we play an important role building lifelong learners and helping individuals improve their critical thinking skills so they can pursue new opportunities that may lead to a better life for themselves and their families. However, we can't do this work alone. The conference sessions emphasized the importance of multiple programs and partners working together to help individuals reduce barriers; seize new opportunities; and meet their personal, academic, and career-related goals.
