Community colleges are committed to finding effective ways to serve learners by equipping them with the skills and credentials needed for future employment. Through ongoing developmental redesign efforts, a growing body of research sheds light on some of the barriers facing underserved learners and proven solutions. Competency-based education (CBE) is an approach with potential to serve such learners. JFF proposes merging promising developmental education redesign models with CBE to increase success for underprepared learners.

There are currently four million jobs in information technology (IT), and the sector is expected to generate an additional 488,500 jobs through 2024, driven by demand for computer and network security, cloud and mobile technology, big data, and Internet-connected devices. By 2018, the majority of jobs in IT will require some postsecondary education, and IT programs often provide career and technical

education (CTE) students with opportunities to earn valuable industry certifications in addition to academic credentials.
