WHAT: Hundreds of thousands of people are facing hardship if the President's FY26 budget is

passed. Community Action Agencies are rallying to their core funding, the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG), which mandates Community Action's mission of fighting poverty and enables them to administer key community programs including Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP), food security programs, homelessness prevention and housing assistance programs, early education and care

programs including Head Start, and so many more.

In the Merrimack Valley, the three Community Action Agencies serve more than 100,000 people. These agencies are a part of the network of 23 Community Action Agencies serving +600,000 in Massachusetts. Community Action Agencies and the people they assist are reaching out to their members of Congress and Senators to support Community Action and to urge that they protect the programs that protect their communities – the Community Services Block Grant at the center of them all. Its elimination would have a devastating impact on our communities.
