16 DAYS AROUND THE DISTRICT From Awareness to Accountability

The 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence is an annual international campaign that kicks off on November 25, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, and runs until December 10, Human Rights Day. It was started by activists at the inaugural Women's Global Leadership Institute in 1991 and continues to be coordinated each year by the Center for Woman's Global Leadership. Zonta's ongoing advocacy impact is built around the "Zonta Says NO to Violence Against Women" campaign, which was launched in 2012. This campaign has raised awareness of the global pandemic of women's rights violations and has united Zonta clubs worldwide in conducting impactful advocacy actions to fight violence against women and gender inequality. During the 16 Days of Activism, all Zonta clubs and districts are encouraged to take part in the Zonta Say NO to Violence Against Women campaign and to take local, national and international actions to influence the making and implementation of laws, as well as changing gender-based attitudes and behaviors to end violence against women. The Zonta Club of Greater Reno partnered with several local domestic violence service providers to host a Community Conversation on domestic violence on November 30. 10 agencies participated as panelists for a 90-minute Zoom session, discussing such topics as intimate partner violence, teen dating, immigrant women and cultural violence, economic repercussions of domestic violence, and surviving after leaving.

The annual display was set up in the lobby of the Domestic Violence Resource Center, and featured a manneguin draped with

garlands of leaves, each leaf representing 100 victims of violence in the State of Nevada. In 2019 there were 37,669 reported cases. The event garnered media publicity from two television stations and promoted donations to participating organizations on Giving Tuesday.
